Residents And Shopkeepers Of Nongthymmai Remain Divided While Fear Of Community Transmission Increases

As the sudden rise in the number of COVID-19 positive cases in Shillong has increased the fear of community transmission, residents and shopkeepers of Nongthymmai remain divided on the idea of imposition of another lockdown.

This comes a few days after a neighbouring locality, Motinagar was converted into a containment zone following the detection of multiple COVID-19 positive cases with no travel history. Speaking on the matter, a resident of Nongthymmai stated, "Although the government is not officially announcing it, community transmission of COVID-19 is underway. Converting Motinagar into a containment zone is not going to improve the situation unless a complete lockdown is imposed on the city."

Meanwhile, local shopkeepers in Nongthymmai stand against the idea of lockdown saying that they have incurred huge losses during the pandemic. Mr. J. Khinbithai, the owner of Khairbithai Electronics said, "I have suffered a huge loss during this pandemic. My shop remained closed for almost 2 months as electronic items are not considered essential commodities. If another lockdown is imposed, it will become very difficult for me to make ends meet." When asked whether he fears community transmission of COVID-19, he said, "It was going to happen sooner or later and until a vaccine is developed, coronavirus is here to stay and we must learn to live with it."
