#### **Activity Report**

#### Green Club Initiative- Sanitary Napkin Collection Campaign- 'Kaho Na Pad Hai'

a. On 24th Jan 2018, MJ JyonitaDeshmukh and Show Producer SanikaMutalik of 95 Big FM were at St. Mira's College for the Sanitary Napkin Collection Campaign- 'Kaho Na Pad Hai'. The objective of this drive was to create awareness about the health benefits of using sterile sanitary napkins as against cloth, to collect sanitary napkins for women in tribal and slum areas in and around Vasai region of Maharashtra and to break the stigma attached to discussions on sanitary napkin use. The ongoing collection drive was organized by 95 Big FM in association with Mumbai based NGO Upasana. This initiative has been inspired by the upcoming movie release – 'Pad Man'.

b. Our staff and students collectively mobilized 245 packets i.e., around 2500 sanitary napkins. We sensitized the students to purchase and donate bio-degradable and cotton-based napkins as far as possible. **79 students** across all faculties actively participated in the interactive session with MJ Jyonita and Sanika. 95 BIG FM was overwhelmed by the fact that we at St. Mira's had partnered them impactfully for this common cause.

The focus was on orientation and sensitization of students regarding responsible behaviour in garbage disposal and general habits of cleanliness. For this- postermaking, talks and documentary screening was done. Last year, the NSS volunteers were given a task of identifying a swacchata related problem in the college campus. Many of the students were of the opinion that the disposal of used sanitary pads needs some improvement. Therefore, the NSS department took a two way initiative of orienting students about responsible ways of disposing of sanitary pads and facilitating it by providing paper bags made out of old newspapers and magazines. NSS volunteers took up the responsibility of orienting and encouraging their classmates in this endeavour throughout the year. The NSS volunteers made the paper bags to be used for this project.


Following programmes were organised by the Dept to create awareness, analyse and sensitize the students about the problem of cleanliness.

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

- 3<sup>rd</sup> August 2017- 'Classroom Cleaning' - The NSS volunteers cleaned college campus and classrooms.




#### a. EYE CHECK-UP CAMP

Veena Kenchi read the annual report and Meenal Sumant presented a vote of thanks.



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


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# 16. PARTICIPATION BY VLOUNTEERS AT THE TRIBAL EXHIBITION.

They helped the stall owners in their communication, auditing and overall organisation of the exhibition.



#### Day 1 - Friday, 1st December 2017





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getting to know the fellow volunteers and their motivation for joining NSS. This was followed by an impromptu group discussion on My Idea of Social Service.

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
# Day 2 - Saturday 2nd December 2017

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer time-Sanctuary followed by exercises.




This was followed by a rally conveying the message of 'Beti Bachao'.



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social media, but it was great to realize that these volunteers are aware of the problems and responsible usage of all forms of media.

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


Our mornings in the camp started with prayer time-Sanctuary followed by Yoga. This was followed by a rally spreading the message of Water Literacy and judicious use of


In the post lunch session, Team Building Games were conducted by Ms. Komal Tujare and Ms. Roma Dar for

This was followed by a rally conveying the message of Swaccha Bharat. To translate the words into action, the NSS volunteers also took up cleaning of the roads in the village.



This was followed by a rally conveying the message of Swaccha Bharat. To translate the words into action, the NSS volunteers also took up cleaning of the roads in the village.


Activities for school children at Satakarwadi ZP school

and occupation in the village. They also tried to gauge the use of internet and mobile amongst the villagers.


In the post-lunch session, a lecture was conducted by Prof. Jyoti Chintan on the topic- Development of Leadership Skills.


#### Day 6 -Wednesday, 6th December 2017

The mid-morning session had a Lecture on Importance of Exercise by Ms. Ekata Jadhav for the volunteers and the primary school children at Parodi.








A Cultural Programme consisting of Dance and Song was arranged by NSS Volunteers for the Villagers.


#### Day 7 – Thursday, 7th December 2017
