Students' seminar for advanced students

The Department of English, St Mira's College for Girls, organised a two-day students' seminar, Women in Theatre: Reclaiming Space' on the 25 th and 26 th of February 2022. After the two very difficult years of the COVID-19 pandemic the seminar was held inperson, on campus; it was a huge success and attended by 54 enthusiastic students. Nine students presented academic papers on themes of spatial and cultural analysis of women in theatre; the relevant pre-history and present historical emergence of drama, patterns in theatre

PG Seminar (Online) - "30 Years of Globalization" with Research Paper Competition

25th- 26th February 2022

Dept of Economics of St. Mira's College for Girls, Pune conducted a PG Seminar in Online mode on 25th and 26th February 2022. 28 participants attended the seminar. In all 15 papers were received covering a wide range of issues like patterns of Privatisations, Sectoral Issues, Formation of Political Ideologies, Impact of Globalization of Women etc. After the received contributions were put through Plagiarism check, 10 papers were selected for presentation.

- Adopting quality enhancement framework to develop LOCF based curriculum-The credits
 calculation of the university has changed for the award of the final degree. It was considered
 that in the revision of the syllabus from the coming year would have to be designed keeping

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
these credits in mind. A workshop on LOCF was proposed to be held for the faculty in January, to familiarize them with the credit system-.

- To strengthen the registrations for the alumni association, increase alumni activity and alumni funding
 - A 6-day long Students Induction Programme with the objective of acclimatizing students to the college.
 - To institutionalize a fund for student support and relief for those affected by COVID-19
 - We continue to strengthen and maintain our earlier collaborations with institutions of excellence like the Women's Studies Centre, SPPU
 - A variety of internships were provided to students for content writing, editing, or at the Intelligence Plus Pvt Ltd, iTeach School, the Borderless World Foundation in Kashmir and Chartered Accountancy firms in Pune.
 - The collaborations with TISS Mumbai, Tata Consultancy and ATS learning solutions for Microsoft certifications still going strong.
 - To further fine tune the feedback system on curriculum from students; teachers, alumni and employers. To include offline qualitative feedback subject wise. Analysis will be forwarded to teachers for use in curriculum development and design
 - In addition to academics our students actively participated in zonal, state, national and international competitions

Globalization and International collaborations:

MILE: Mira International Learning Exchange: A Centre for Virtual Collaboration, collaborated with LaGuardia Community College's COIL to conduct 6 courses in collaboration. 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
- 4. Certificate course in Introduction to Psychology- St. Mira's College in collaboration with ArtSphere had run an introductory course on Psychology

Student Induction Programme (SIP)-

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Green Initiatives

The year 2016 witnessed the inception of a Green Club at St. Mira's College. This is a voluntary initiative of the College comprising faculty and students. Its objective is to sensitize the students about the 3Rs -'Reduce, Re-use and Re-cycle' by employing a two-pronged approach of advocacy and engagement. It is our belief that our tiny steps towards environment conservation will eventually have a cascading effect in the neighbourhood. The main aim of Green Club is to involve the student community to keep their surrounding green and clean, undertaking plantation of trees and to imbibe habits and lifestyle for minimum waste generation, separation of waste and disposing the waste to the nearest storage point.

- Green Club and NSS Department held a Panel Discussion titled 'Eliminating Plastic' on 25th June 2021 to churn out ways to cut down plastic and adopt more sustainable ways of living.
- The guest lecture, 'Sustainable Fashion' was organized on 14 th September 2021 to guide the students on Sustainable living. It was an engaging session which highlighted:
 - The concept and practice of Sustainable fashion
 - · Maintenance of sustainable fashion
 - Encouraging sustainable waste management at home
- On the 28th of March, a webinar was held on 'Sustainable Garden'. The speaker spoke about sustainability and how it can help our environment. The students learned how composting, waste segregation, growing plants and what type of natural fertilizers are best for which type of plants.

Value Based Education, Art of Living & Sanctuary

The College aims at women empowerment through value-based education as believed by our founder Sadhu T.L. Vaswani. The day begins with an effort to cultivate the soul, with a visit to the Sanctuary, a special place where we spend a short time devoted to prayer, reflection, introspection and narrations on the ART OF LIVING. This has been formalized as a non CGPA 2 credit course.

Extension Activities

The college has continued its collaborations with various NGOs and organisations and conducted extension activities for the year 2021-22. The NSS department has extensively conducted online activities with their volunteers for the year. Two SOUL programmes were conducted enabling the reach of education to the less advantaged sections of our society. A total of 1277 students participated in 14 extension programmes along with NSS activities

<u>SOUL:</u> Social Online United Learning: The department of English conducted online one-on-one teaching sessions which involved students of the college being first trained to teach spoken English online to young residents of Ambral Panchgani and Aasra, an NGO in Pune. In addition senior advanced students of the college took regular online classes with students of the college who required help in English.
