## OUR PARENT BODY

The Sadhu Vaswani Mission is a world renowned humanitarian service organisation with an international presence across four continents. Founded originally in Hyderabad-Sind before the partition of India as the Brotherhood Association, it was renamed after its revered founder Sadhu Vaswani when the Sindhi community was forced to leave Pakistan. Sadhu Vaswani chose to make Pune his headquarters, and from here the Mission and its activities have grown by quantum leaps. Today, the Sadhu Vaswani Mission is a non-sectarian institution which believes in the unity of all religions and reveres the Great Ones of all faiths. The Mission serves all sections of society with no prejudice relating to caste, creed or community. Its service activities today embrace several spheres that influence people's lives - social, educational, medical, environmental and spiritual.

The Sadhu Vaswani Mission is registered as a 501(c)(3) tax exempt charitable corporation. The objects of the Trust are:

- (i) To spread the message of brotherhood, unity and harmony.
- (ii) To promote cultural and spiritual development by starting centres of training in concentration, character building and social service.

# One Hundred Years Of Dada

## PUT GOD FIRST!

*Is there life after death?*

*I believe so.*

*Was there life before birth?*

*I am certain there was!!!*

And, the day she does not write a letter, Dad enquires if all is well!

I have known and revered Dada as far back as the stretch of my memory!

Even as a child, I have felt a deep connect with him! And, I have witnessed so many miracles, I could write a book!

When I was just 18, I fell almost fatally ill with a combination of Jaundice, Typhoid and Malaria.... with a hemoglobin count of just four and a fever that would shoot up to a 106! The doctors had given up on me and suggested I be taken home and allowed to die in peace..... When Dada appealed to them saying: "Dava aapki Dua Unki....milke koshish karte hai!" (Let us try the combination of your medication and the Lord's mercy!) And... the miracle was thus for all to witness!

Dada seemed to know the role he had in mind for me.....

I came from a background which was not financially strong. The year I completed my graduation my father retired from government service and I felt obliged to take up a full time job to supplement the family income. I got a job offer in a bank and went to seek Dada's permission to accept the offer.

Dada suggested I complete my Post Graduation and then take up a Job.

The day I completed my Masters, I got the job of a lecturer in my College in a clear vacancy with a permanent Government Job!

Was it a coincidence or a divine design?

A few years later, Dada suggested I study further and acquire a doctoral degree... with my full-time teaching assignments and my love for the evening satsang which I attended daily, I hardly found time for research... Although I had registered for my Ph.D. and completed my field work in 5 years... That is when I had a fall and sustained multiple fractures in my leg, keeping me confined to the bed. Once again, it was Dada who suggested that I utilize this period of confinement to complete my thesis writing!!!

In the year 1999, when the earlier principal of the College retired, the Government ruled that the Principal of a college should necessarily be a Doctorate Degree holder and so Dada asked me to occupy the chair of the Principal (a chair which he had once, so efficiently occupied) superseding my seniors who had also been my professors! I was reluctant.... In fact I protested saying I had always visualized myself as a Mira with a tanpura..... this was a Mira with Arjuna's bow and arrow! A total mismatch!

Was it??? Or was it by his design?? He knew - he is the worker, I am only his instrument. At every step, every single day, especially during the first six months. Dada enquired about my daily routine, the work I did, the challenges I faced. He guided me, mentored me, and led me by the hand!

In my office, I have Dada's table - the table he used when he was the Principal. Any problem file - any difficult case, any obstacle with regard to government grants, government affiliations, government approvals, recognitions are passed on to him and kept at his table. And he always finds a solution. Can it always be by default? Or is it a divine design?

His college, with him at the helm has grown from a single stream College which started with 62 students to a multi-stream college - Arts, Commerce, BBA, BCA, BCS, MA, and MCOM and over 3000 girl students.

Under his timely guidance and support the College has taken a giant leap----

- Being the first city college to volunteer for the NAAC accreditation and be accredited with a 5 star rating
- Being, the first Arts/Commerce/Science College in the State of Maharashtra to be taken the fast track to Academic Autonomy.
- Being amongst the first 18 colleges in the country with Potential for Excellence, receiving a grant of crore of rupees
- Being declared as the best College by the affiliating Savitribai Phule Pune University.

Is all this a coincidence?

Or a divine design?

While others envy our awards and accomplishments Dada keeps us grounded by saying, "Put God first! All else is a zero, if you put God first, the zeroes have a multiplier effect. If you put God last, the zeroes are meaningless!"

## THE YOGI PRINCIPAL

St. Mira's College for Girls made a humble beginning in 1962. It had only sixty-two students on its roll. Prof. K.N. Vaswani, a Gandhian was its first principal. He left after three months, handing over the reins of the college to the able hands of Dada J.P. Vaswani.

As a principal, Dada showed the sterling qualities of love, compassion, humility and discipline. He handled the staff members gently and with wit. Though he had a one to one relationship with the students, he was very firm with them. A second batch student narrates:

“Initially I had nurtured a grudge against my parents and elders for enrolling me in a girls college and that too in the arts stream. I had wanted to join science stream to qualify as a doctor. Looking back it was my karmic treasure to be able to just be within his aura to listen raptly to him in sanctuary and the classroom and focus on his face.

He inspired us the young girls to break through the glass ceiling that invariably affects and directs the course of woman's life. His words ‘the woman should be known by what she does than to whom she belongs, her work should always be vital to her self-image’ inspired me without end. He asked us to educate ourselves to empower not just ourselves but others also.”

On one occasion, a lecturer did not come on a particular day. Dada called her and asked her with a sweet smile, why she was absent yesterday. She replied 'It was raining and I come on a scooter from Pashan.'

What was Dada's reply? He said, 'Either you buy a rain coat or ask God not to let it rain.'

The lecturer apologised.

Many staff members had wonderful experiences with Dada as a Principal of the college. He was kind and compassionate. With his keen perfection he could read the thoughts of his teachers. An elderly lady who had joined the college in 1962, and whom Dada respected as ‘Mother’, gave the following testimony: "I had undergone an operation. I was ill and depressed. One day Brother Jashan called me, and told me not to tax myself with work. He also put before me a small envelope, saying it was a little help from his side. When I went home, I found that the envelope contained a substantial amount of money which I needed to pay for the operation. This gesture touched me deeply. I think the 'spiritual' also works through the 'material'."

Another incident during this period which many of us witnessed is: 'A peon working in a Mira Institutions stole several expensive things. The police caught him and brought him to the principal, J.P. Vaswani. The policemen, who caught him and brought him to the college, thought that their act would be appreciated but as soon as our Revered Principal saw the policemen he at once said to them, "Why have you brought this shewak here? All these things belong to him."

Dada J.P. Vaswani often says, "The sinner of today may be a saint of tomorrow."

Dada J.P. Vaswani often conducted the sanctuary himself. His sanctuary at St. Mira's was blissfully peaceful. Inspirational messages along with meditation and prayers from all scriptures were recited. There was silence and in that silence lay the deepest communication between him and the students.



# TEACHING EXPERIENCE IN THE COLLEGE 1962-1997

We often, with pride, consider ourselves as rational beings and yet sometimes our smooth-flowing life takes a twist and a turn which involuntarily transforms us. It can turn doubters into believers.

I grew up in a home where the atmosphere was predominantly both rational and with intellectual leanings. My father, an officer in the Education Department, was an out and out rational person. My mother, though a devout soul, was not a blind believer. Such was the home in which I was nurtured. I started my teaching career in St. Mira's College, in the year 1962. My father met Dada to apprise him of this. Dada's words on that occasion still ring in my ears and will be in my mind as long as I live. Dada lovingly told my father, "Mr. Ratnaparkhi, hereafter Asha's worries are my worries!"

Slowly over the years my financial condition improved and stability entered my life. A great calm and assurance descended upon me. I held on to the firm belief that Dada was my burden bearer.

In the year 1991, I was in a position to afford a small flat. It was my fervent prayer that Dada should come and bless my humble dwelling. However, during the same time, a host of health issues besieged Dadaji and he was unable to personally visit my home but, one night, I had a dream in which I saw Dadaji coming and blessing both me and my home. I can still vividly see Dada seated near a 'Yadnya Kund' beckoning me. When I went near he gave me a coconut and blessed me abundantly. From that day onwards my home is certainly full of peace. It may not house the most modern amenities but it certainly boasts of a great spiritual being's blessings!

After my retirement I went to visit Dada... he looked at me and suggested, "Asha after your retirement you should join a social organization and work for it."

The same week I was invited to join a social organization and work for it... one called "The National Association for the Blind" at Khandala. I remembered Dada's advice and accepted the offer. I have been working for it for the last nineteen wonderful years. This cup of joy has also been proffered by Dada's blessings.

- Dr. Jyoti Mungal has published a chapter in a book on Dalit literature.

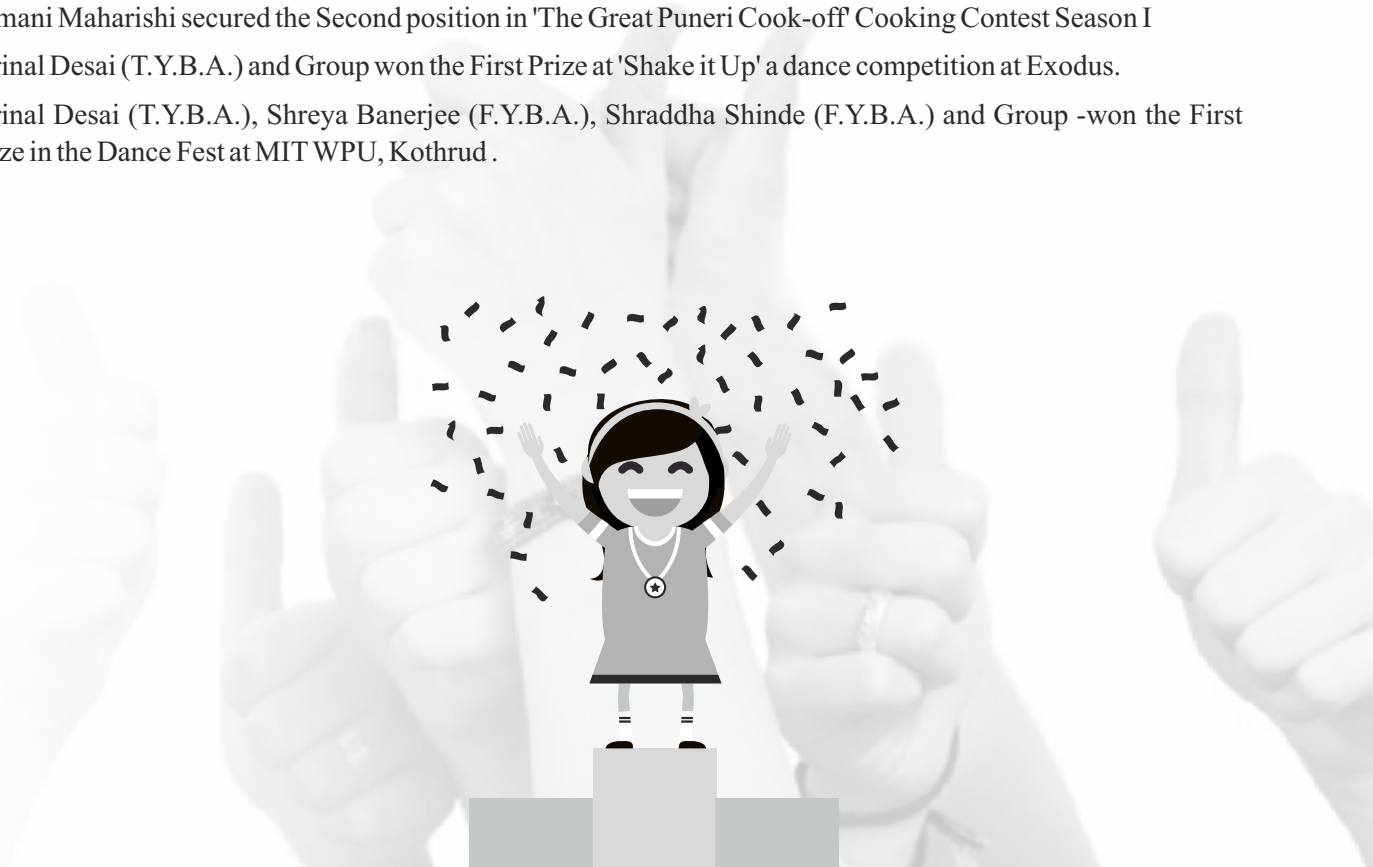
## Student Achievements

## College News 2017-2018

The academic year 2017-18 was as always an eventful one. Allow us to take you on a quick round up of the College Activities for this year:

### Our Quality Initiatives:

#### I. Additional Credit Courses

St. Mira's has launched some Additional Credit Courses for its under-graduate students, with an aim to add value to the degrees conferred on them and better equip them for a competitive world. The following courses were introduced during this academic year:

- Dance - Dr. Snober Sataravala co-ordinated a dance extra credit course called 'Style Intensive'. The students learnt a number of technical terms and studied three styles: crump, contemporary and hip hop.

In the second semester she co-ordinated the Romeo and Juliet dance course as well as a course on Cartooning.

- Spanish - Mrs. Suhaile Azavedo co-ordinated a credit course in Spanish conducted by Ms. Komal Tujare. The course covered the basics of Spanish as a foreign language, an introduction to the country and culture of Spain, and beginners - level 1 in conversation.
- Painting - Ms. Roma Dar was the Course Coordinator for the Painting Extra Credit course conducted from 31st August to 15th September, 2017, taught by Ms. Vidhi Tharwani (artist at Expressions, Pvt. Ltd). 16 students created two Acrylic paintings each, through an assimilation of various artistic techniques taught by Ms. Tharwani. The students were also taught the basics of colour theory, form and perception.
- Physical Fitness - Ms. Minakshi Balkawade, Coordinated a Credit course on Physical Fitness which was a huge hit among the students. The course was conducted by a Freelance Fitness Trainer, Mr. Ajay Dhaygave, Founder of ADD FITNESS. In addition to physical fitness exercises he also gave important tips on physical wellness which included lifestyle changes to be undertaken for an overall healthy life.
- ECCE - Early Childhood Care and Education credit course was floated for the students and conducted at Sadhu Vaswani Mission's Teachers Training Institute. 36 students enrolled and completed the course from 7th August 2017 to 11th September 2017. This course co-ordinated by Mrs. Hasina Shaikh.
- Tally 9 - Accounts Department conducted a Tally 9 Basics Credit Course. Tally 9 is an Accounting software for small and medium businesses. This course gave chance to students to acquire knowledge about voucher entry, ledger creation and generation of reports.
- Gender and Culture - The department of Sociology conducted a Certificate Course with a three months duration in 'Undergraduate Certificate Course in Gender and Culture' in collaboration with Women's Studies Centre, SPPU from July to September 2017. A total of 32 students from first year and second year BA, specializing in Sociology, Psychology, and English, etc. had enrolled for the course. This course introduced participants to gender perspectives, specifically to the sector of gender; culture and media so as to enable them study/ work in this field further and introduce students to writing research/ field report. This course focused on: Culture - Gender Perspectives, Studying Cultural Practices - Ways of reading, Studying Cultural Practices - Ways of seeing, Untangling contemporary cases/issues - Gender, culture and politics and Field/ Research work.
- Digital Marketing - An overwhelming response was received for this course and hence it was conducted in 2 batches of 60 students each: Batch I - 05th Jul to 26th July and Batch II - 31st July to 27th Aug 2017. The Course Instructor was Anshuman Sen, Founder and CEO of Semat Institute. Students from BBA, BCA, BCOM, BA and M.Com. enrolled for this course, which was specially designed for St Mira's College as it involved creative content writing. The course prerequisite was that the students have basic computer and Microsoft office



knowledge, as its aim was to encourage them to start their own online blog or business through which they might be able to become financially independent.

- GBS Certification - The Course Instructors were Mr. Manish Tapadia and Ms. Aparna Thadhani. 59 students from BBA and B.Com. having a finance background enrolled for this course which commenced from 6th July - 1st September 2017. This course was designed for students who were keen to work with global shared service centers and third party BPOs. The key contents of the course were: understanding the terminology used in BPS and Shared Service Industry, learning to apply and use the language related to Finance & Accounting Domain from Day "Zero", appreciate the technology used while working to make processes efficient and effective and determining the importance of SLAs and KPIs and governance.
- Image Management - The Course Instructor was Mihika Bhanot, which was from 2nd September to 11th September 2017, comprising of 75 students in a batch. The objective of the credit course was to make the students more confident by just dressing up in the right way and following etiquettes, introduce the importance of Image Management and the 4 A's of Image, the right way of dressing for the appropriate role, goal and occasion, make each participant aware of her body shape and the clothes that suit her, cluster clothing garments so that there can be versatility in clothing and apply the right corporate etiquette in interviews and business meetings.
- Listening Skills extra credit course for TYBA students was offered from 6th to 12th March, 2018 which helped the students enhance skills of listening, acquaint students with capacity for self awareness and empathy and to help the students understand the role of mindfulness in listening.

## II. Green Initiatives

The Green Club which was started in the year 2016 is a voluntary initiative of the College comprising faculty and students. Its objective is to sensitize the students about the 3Rs - 'Reduce, Re-use and Re-cycle' by employing a two-pronged approach of advocacy and engagement. It is our belief that our tiny steps towards environment conservation will eventually have a cascading effect in the neighbourhood.

The following activities were conducted during 2017-18:

### 1. Eco-friendly Ganapati Idol-making Activity

Last year, the students of the Green Club were inspired after viewing a video on You Tube and after learning the nuances from a professional artist. This year, the students handled the making of the idol themselves, with a little input from the teachers.

This year, we prepared the idol on 24th August, 2017 using wet paper and 'shaadumatti'(river bed clay) mixed with

some organic resin. Care was taken to use lentil seeds and sago for decoration of Lord Ganesha's headgear. The students also prepared a small mouse-Bappa's charioteer- out of waste material.

Our 'Green Bappa' was installed on 25th August-the first day of 'GaneshaSthapana' in the Sanctuary- a place where all Miraites (Degree College and Junior College) spend some time every morning , imbibing good values, good thoughts and in meditation. The idol was installed for a period of 5 days during which students handled the 'pooja', 'aarti' and 'prasad' distribution to all. This year, our Ganeshotsav festivities received live coverage from 95Big FM. We had MJ Sangram in our midst much to the joy of the students.

On the day of the 'Visarjan', the sound of drum beats and cries of 'Ganpati Bappa' and 'Pudchya Varshi Laukar Ya' resonated on the campus. With this, our 'Green Bappa' was surrendered to his watery abode.

Instead of conducting the immersion at the river side, we immersed our 'Bappa' in a bucket of clean water as was done earlier. Last year, the dissolved clay found its way back into the plants on our campus. This year, more soil was added in the clay and water solution and seeds were sown in the same. The idea was to use the saplings emerging from the germinated seeds for greening our campus.

## **2. Guest Lecture on "Positive Thinking and Cleanliness in Pune City"**

A Guest Lecture titled: "Positive Thinking and Cleanliness in Pune City" was organized on 1st Sept. 2017. The lecture was delivered by Mr. Minocher Patel, Motivational Speaker, Corporate Trainer and author of the national best seller, "Ordinary to Extraordinary".

The focus of Mr. Patel's lecture was on positive thinking, self-development, loving oneself, having confidence and emotional independence. According to him, the road map to success and happiness lie in the two P's, viz. 'Passion' and 'Pride'. With reference to Passion he opined, "Passion prevails when all else fails". Pride is a personal commitment to a cause- that is being a responsible citizen.

He further stressed that women are better placed in making a difference in the society. His views were consistent with those of Dada J.P. Vaswani who has often said 'if you educate a woman, you educate a family'. He encouraged students to come forward and take on the responsibility of keeping Pune City- clean and smart.

His talk was at the behest of the Adar Poonawalla [social arm of the Serum Institute of India] which has partnered with the Pune Municipal Corporation for management of solid waste, provision of litter bins across Pune City, support vehicles and conservancy staff for garbage clearance, information and outreach programs for citizens' awareness.

Mr. Patel created awareness about the availability of the APCCI application on smart phones which can be used for uploading photographs of 'dirt and filth' for immediate action.

The programme was well received by more than 200 students and faculty of St. Mira's College. The participants pledged to commit themselves to the cause. The programme concluded with the Vote of Thanks and singing of the National Anthem.

The Adar Poonawalla Foundation has kindly obliged the college by providing us with the services of their "Glutton Machine" for campus clean up as part of their CSR initiative.

## **3. In-house Workshop on Newspaper Bag-making**

A newspaper bag-making workshop was conducted on 7th December, 2017. This was an exercise of learning-by-doing'. The exercise commenced with our in-house faculty Ms. Jyoti Chintan introducing some of our other Green Club Faculty (Ms. S Iyer, Ms. Rajni Singh, Ms. Deepanjali Mazumdar and Ms. Deepali Agarwal) to the nuances of newspaper-bag making. Thereafter, a students workshop was undertaken where the taught took up the task of teaching. More than 80 bags were made by the students and faculty. These bags were to be used for sale of manure



(harvested on campus).

#### **4. Greeting Card-Making and Candle-making**

Our Green Club Faculty, namely, Ms. Komal Tujare and Ms. Roma Dar inspired our student members to make Greeting Cards and decorative Candles by recycling old cards, used decoration items and used wax candles. This was done to instill in the students the idea of creating 'wealth- out-of-waste'.

#### **5. Garden Waste Management**

In 2016-17, our College has undertaken an on-campus project for garden waste composting. The services of a professional garden waste management organisation named 'Green Thumb' headed by Mr. Firdosh Roowalla have been employed for this purpose in September 2016. The supervision of this project is being done by the Department of BBA and the Green Club.

Four wire mesh bins have been placed in a reserved area where the dry leaves from foliage on campus are collected for composting. The collected leaves are watered regularly for compression and acceleration of the composting process. About 800 kgs of manure was harvested between 14-15th December 2017. It is now available for sale to staff and students at a nominal price of Rs.10/- per packet (made out of newspaper). Bulk purchase by staff and students is encouraged based on 'bring your own bag' philosophy.

#### **6. Green Club Sale**

This year the Green Club declared its intention to mobilise resources for College Garden maintenance. It was decided that the Mira Bazaar would be a suitable platform for doing so, since it attracts many footfalls. This exercise commenced with a pre-sale orientation during Sanctuary about the benefits of Re-use and Recycling. The theme of this exercise was "Óld is Gold".

At the Mira Bazaar, the Green Club put up two stalls-one dedicated for a Jumble Sale of pre-owned apparel (ethnic and western womens wear and menswear) and the other focussing on sale of pre-owned costume jewellery, greeting cards and candles (made out of recycled material) and the vermi-compost manure harvested on campus. All items were nominally priced between Rs.10/- to Rs.50/- each. The vermi-compost packets were available for Rs.10/- each. The Sale generated a revenue of Rs. 4481/- from pre-owned apparel, Rs1675/-from restored jewellery and remade candles and Rs1200/- from manure, harvested on-campus from the Garden Waste Management Project.

#### **7. Sanitary Napkin Donation Campaign- 'Kaho Na Pad Hai'**

The Green Club, St. Mira's College collaborated with 95Big FM and Mumbai based NGO- 'Upasana' for the campaign 'KAHO NA PAD HAI'. MJ Jyonita Deshmukh and Show Producer Sanika Mutalik of 95 Big FM were at St. Mira's College for the sanitary napkin pad collection drive. on 24th Jan, 2018. They were felicitated by the Principal, Dr. Gulshan Gidwani, with literature of the Sadhu Vaswani Mission and packets of campus harvested Manure.

The objectives of this drive were to create awareness about the health benefits of using sterile sanitary napkins as against cloth, to collect sanitary napkins for tribal and other deprived women from slums in the Vasai region in Maharashtra and further to break the stigma attached to discussions on sanitary napkins. This initiative has been inspired by the upcoming movie release -'Pad Man'.

St. Mira's College stands by the ideals of our revered Founder Sadhu T.L. Vaswani and has imbibed the spirit of giving whenever the need arises. When 95 Big FM approached our institution, the staff and students collectively mobilized 245 packets (big and small) within 48 hours which amounted to around 2500 sanitary napkins. We sensitized the students to

purchase and donate bio-degradable and cotton based napkins as far as possible.

During the interactive session with 95 Big FM, 79 students across all faculties actively participated. MJ Jyonita and Sanika were overwhelmed by the fact that we at St. Mira's had partnered them impactfully for this common cause.

### **III. CWE**

CWE is an initiative taken by the Departments of Business Studies and BBA.

Vision Statement: CWE aims to create an environment that promotes and stimulates the spirit of entrepreneurship among the students of the college.

Mission Statement: The Centre seeks to achieve the spirit of entrepreneurship through educational programs, events, activities and research.

At the inaugural function on August 8th, 2017, the Chief Guest was Ms. Nabomita Mazumdar who is a social evangelist based in Mumbai and '100 Women Achievers' awardee by Ministry of Women & Child Development, President of India. Ms. Mazumdar had the students captivated by the enlightening talk on entrepreneurship development. "The battle is with the ideas in the making, not gender or times or circumstances", said Nabomita.

We are happy to announce that, St. Mira's College will act as a Facilitation Centre in creating awareness and disseminate information on the National Entrepreneurship Awards (NEAS) 2017 under The Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MoSDE).

On the 11th of September, 2017, the CWE arranged for an interaction with Mr. Amit Vijay Pokarna, an agri-horticulture entrepreneur, the owner of Camp Water's Edge, and Khushboo farms, and has been in the agricultural industry for almost 20 years. He spoke about entrepreneurship in this field by highlighting the newest trends in agriculture and rural marketing. Mr. Amit covered the three main reasons for initiating a start up - money, recognition and satisfaction; at least two out of the three need to be achieved in order to make the business sustainable.

#### **Activities under the banner of CWE:**

- **Mira Bazaar**

The grand gala annual fest 'Mira Bazaar' was organized on 16th December 2017 inaugurated at the hands of Mrs. Soniya Konjetti, founder of PULA - an online platform for bringing together women entrepreneurs and Mrs. Shaila Limaye, Managing Trustee -Majhi Maitrin. The event primarily aims to inculcate and hone the multiple skills of research, costing, production, promotion and customer service amongst girl students across all faculties. Further, the outside participation challenged the students for better strategy and execution. Around 50 Stalls of foodstuff, handmade jewellery, clothes, accessories, candles, greeting cards, cosmetics, games, health products, mehendi, tattoo art etc. As a part of social entrepreneurship outreach, the green club hosted two stalls in Mira Bazaar which sold handmade jewellery, manure, pre-owned clothes and décor. The proceeds from the sale of these items were used for green initiatives of the college. The Coordinators of the event were Ms. Jyoti Chintan and Ms. Rajni Singh

- **Awareness Talk**

Mrs. Abhradita Chatterjee Nahvi and Mrs. Shanthi Fernandes, delivered a brief talk on the aim and purpose of the Centre for Women Entrepreneurship (CWE) and the role of Incubation Centre to promote and support entrepreneurial skills and talents, to the members of the Student Development Cell during the program of Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan which was organized on 18th January, 2018.

- **Student Activity**

Few students put up a stall for sale of eatables during the Romeo and Juliet musical on 22nd December, 2017 from



6.30 pm to 8.00 pm. The activity was organized under the able guidance of our Principal Dr. Gulshan Gidwani, Dr. Rama Venkatachalam, Dr. Dimple Buche and Mrs. Shanthi Fernandes.

The event included the following activities and development of skills such as negotiating with vendors, placing orders and purchasing, preparation of sandwiches by the students and packing, sale of packaged mineral water, sandwiches, samosas, tea and coffee and preparation and finalization of accounts.

- **Career Guidance**

A Career Guidance Lecture by TIME, Pune was conducted in the Auditorium on January 24th, 2018, for SY Students. The seminar was conducted by Mr. Vishal Nandargi- faculty member from TIME. He explained the competitive examination structure and the options available to the students after graduation. He also cleared the concepts regarding GRE, GMAT, CAT and other MBA entrance examinations. He stressed on the fact that while deciding the career path, students should think long term while keeping in mind their interest and ability.

- **Incubation Centre**

An Orientation session for setting up an Incubation Centre in collaboration with TISS, Mumbai, was organized on 3rd February, 2018. The speakers introduced the objectives of the Incubation Centre to the participants. They emphasized mentoring, coaching, resource pooling, provision of shared spaces as main objectives.

In an intensive interactive format Dr. Majumdar and Mr. Duru spoke about identification of the urge to take up an entrepreneurial venture, goals, research and legal requirements. They also focused on information relating to start-ups, customers, markets, networking, innovation and latest trends.

The main highlight of the programme was speakers' narration of exemplary stories of successful entrepreneurs which left the audience mesmerized.

#### IV. SANCTUARY

Our aim at St. Mira's, is WOMEN EMPOWERMENT through value-based education which was the vision of our founder Sadhu T. L. Vaswani. Our day begins with an effort to cultivate the soul. This interlude with the spiritual happens every morning with a visit to the Sanctuary, a special place where we spend a short time devoted to prayer, reflection, introspection and narrations on the ART OF LIVING. In short it is a platform for teachers and students to talk about what they believe in, problems that bother them and to understand the teachings of various enlightened souls.

Some of the topics covered during this year in the Sanctuary were Gratitude, Mindfulness, Positive Affirmations, Motivation, Importance of Love, Teachings of Vivekananda, Environment Awareness, Compassion, Meditation, Palki - the significance of Pandharpur Yatra, etc.

## V. Social Outreach

### 1. Social Service

Social service is an integral part of our co-curricular activities. Character building is an essential focus of our education. Through our social service programme, we try to sensitise the students towards their social responsibilities.

Social Service Programmes were organized to celebrate Sadhu Vaswani's 138th Birthday, Dada J. P. Vaswani's 99th Birthday and also during the Mahayagna and Thanksgiving Week. Our students from Junior and Senior college, along with their class teachers visited various organizations like Maher Orphanage, Isha Prem Niketan, Sawli, Shreevatsa, Bharatiya Samajseva Kendra, The Doctor Foundation, Socio-Economic Development Trust and Niwant Andha Mukta Vikasalaya. They distributed grocery items, stationary, hygiene care products, warm clothes and blankets and also served breakfast at the Poona Blind School.

In keeping with our Founder's teaching - 'animals too are our brothers', the FYBBA students visited RESQ, an Animal Rescue NGO and donated Dog food, syringes, hot water bags, worth Rs. 8000.

The Social Service Programme aims at a gradual transformation of our students into responsible and committed citizens. We hope that these experiences of Social Service will be gradually converted into a lifetime of service to others!!

### 2. Corporate Social Responsibility Initiatives

On 16th January, 2018, the department of Sociology organized a guest lecture on 'Volunteering in an initiative to transform education practices' by Mr. Dalmia from TickLinks. TickLinks is a voluntary initiative started by Mr. Dalmia in 2016. The students responded spontaneously and six students registered as volunteers for this work. Two students of S.Y.B.A.(History) - Durriya Nagarwala and Aishwarya Uppal - are interning with 'Ticklinks', a start-up which aims at creating an online open resources video library providing access to various schools, to make teaching-learning more interesting for the students.

Aditi Sarkar, M.A student, volunteered for 'Teach for India' an NGO working in the field of Education. She committed two hours every day (January - March 2018) to teaching English to children from poor families who could not afford to take up private tuitions.

The Psychology department had organized an orientation by Connecting NGO on 1st August 2017 during the sanctuary. The NGO is dedicated to preventing suicide in youths. Connecting and its team serve the community through its various programs, seminars and Suicide Prevention Helplines. An orientation session was organized by the NGO where their volunteers, Ms. Seeba and Ms. Prajakta, informed the student about the objective of the NGO and how students could contribute to the cause. Several students expressed an interest in volunteering for the same.

As a part of their social outreach activity an induction session was organized for the students who wished to volunteer for Connecting NGO on 1st September, 2017. The session was conducted by Ms. Seeba along with the other volunteers of the NGO. The facilitators through their presentation explained to the students the various aspects of suicide among youths. They discussed various reasons and risk factors for committing, suicide, myths, realities and protective factors. They emphasized the role of self-awareness of one's own and others' emotions in prevention of suicide. They also clarified the role that the students would play as volunteers. The students who wished to volunteer would have to undergo Mentorship Programs and Listening Skills Training.

Centre for Mental Health Services- School Counselling Remediation (CMHS-SCR) in collaboration with Teach for India, provides training and internship programs to graduate and undergraduate students to train them in the field of

school counselling and remediation. Twelve of SYBA and four of TYBA students have been placed in one of the low income schools identified by Teach for India where they counsel and mentor the students about various emotional and behavioural issues. Each student goes through intensive supervised training 8 hours a week for 6 months. They undergo hands-on training and complete online and offline lectures. They also undergo assessments based on the lectures.

Zensar CSR- Corporate Social Responsibility Department of Zensar Technologies aims at running transformational programs like community mobilization and development. It aims at developing resilience and motivation within communities so that they can be empowered for change. The initial phase of the internship would be primarily of visiting families in the community and interacting with them with the help of SALT Technique (an acronym for Support / Appreciate / Listen / Team) which has been the key strategy for community relationship building. 20 students from Psychology and Sociology department participated in the outreach.

FYBA and TYBA education students weekly conducted activities on craft, drawing, brain game and painting in Dhanwantri School, Ganj Peth, Pune. This was to ensure that the students get hands on teaching experience and help underprivileged children.

Teaching the students of classes 8th and 9th at 'Pujya Kasturba Gandhi English Medium School', a government school run by the Akanksha Foundation for a period of 10 days. In the course of this initiative, 32 girls from SY B.Com had the opportunity to essay the role of a teacher.

Our students helped as volunteers for a 10 day free health check up camp for auto rickshaw drivers of Pune, organised by The Hind Shakti Social Foundation, Free health check-ups were organised for more than 3000 auto rickshaw drivers.

## **VI. Conferences and Seminars**

This year the college hosted one National level Conference on "Public Policy, Governance and Advocacy: Towards a Sustainable Society" on February 9-10, 2018.

This Conference was a collaborative effort of the Departments of Economics, History, Politics and Public Administration. It aimed at bringing together diverse stakeholders of civil society on a common platform in order to stimulate a dialogue and deliberate on the role of public policy, governance and advocacy in bringing about an inclusive and sustainable society.

The Inaugural Address was delivered by the internationally acclaimed Prof (Dr) Anupam Saraph, CIO, Pune City, Leadership Coach, Strategy and Innovation Mentor whose expertise has been tapped effectively by the Governments of India and Goa, by corporates and others in the areas of Sustainable Design, E-Governance, Smart Cities and Capacity Building. The other sessions included "Historical Legacies and Contexts of Public Policy and Governance", "Sustainable Partnerships and Inclusive Societies: Filling Gaps and Strengthening Governance", "Changing Perspectives of Public Policy Development", "Sustainable Partnerships & Inclusive Societies : Challenges and Issues".

The eminent resource persons included Dr Shruti Tambe, Prof. and Head, Dept. of Sociology, SPPU, Pune and Mr. Manish Puranik, CSR Consultant (historical legacies), Ms. Aneeta Gokhale Benninger, Executive Director CDSA, Pune and Ms. Dnyanada Palkar, Senior Research Associate at Pahle India Foundation, New Delhi (Governance Gaps), Ms Netra Shirke, Corporator (NCP), Navi Mumbai Municipal Corporation (NMMC) and Ms Neeta Pawar Chalke, a social activist from Mashaal, a Pune-based NGO (Changing perspectives), Mr. Ramanath Jha, former IAS Officer, Maharashtra Cadre and Dr. Rajeshwari Deshpande, Prof. and Head, Dept. of Politics and Public Administration, SPPU (sustainable partnerships), Dr. (Mrs) Malati Roy, Former, Head, Dept. of Economics, S.P. College, Pune (Valedictory Session). The Conference was sponsored by the SPPU and also received financial support from Forbes Marshall Pvt. Ltd, Pune and the Unique Academy, Pune. Candid Services and Unique



Corporation served as our hospitality (beverage) partners. The Conference received a positive response from within and outside Maharashtra with 25 outside participants (faculty) and more than 100 students participants.

## VII. Inter Disciplinary/Inter Departmental Student Enrichment Programmes

- Ms. Roma Dar was invited by faculty from BBA, BCA and BCom to deliver a guest lecture to first year BBA, BCA and second year B.Com. students on 23rd August, 2017. This inter-disciplinary lecture was conducted to give the students a comprehensive introduction to various aspects of the blog writing process-both creative and technical. It moved on to the nuances of preparation for a job interview, post-interview etiquette, and walked students through the various stages during an interview.
- On the 11th of December, Ms. Komal Tujare was invited by the Department of Commerce to deliver a lecture to the students of S.Y.B.Com. on the construction of a sentence and paragraph and the use of business phrases and idioms to embellish their writing.
- On the 12th of December as an inter-departmental activity Dr Vaishali Joshi explained to the students of the SYBA Optional English class the meaning of Madhura Bhakti and Virahini which is so central to the Mira bhajans that they study. She also enlightened them about the life of that remarkable woman
- On the 14th of February Komal Tujare gave a lecture to the TYBA English special students on Walter Benjamin and on the 21st of February Dr. Vaishali Diwakar addressed the same class on Post modernism and Baudrillard.
- Dr. Jaya Rajagopalan, Department of Psychology, conducted a guest lecture on Neo Five Factor Personality Test (NEO-PI) for T.Y.B.Com students on 12th September, 2017. Mrs. Sharmin Palsetia conducted a workshop on "Inter-relation between Marketing and Psychology" for B.Com students on 6th September, 2017, a guest lecture on Myers-Brigg Type Indicator (MBTI) for T.Y.B.Com students on 7th September, 2017 and on "Employee Assistance Programs" for B.Com students on 8th February 2018. She also delivered a lecture on Stress Management on 6th and 7th Feb 2018 for the FYBBA(CA) students in which the following topics were covered: Business Etiquettes, Ice Breaker Game, Relaxation Exercise, Role Play and Problem Solving Tools.
- Mrs. Rekha Kankariya conducted a guest lecture on 'Royalty Accounts' on 9th December 2017, for F.Y.B.Com students.
- Vachan Prerana Din is celebrated on 15th October 2017. The following activities were organized to encourage and inculcate reading habits among the students by Ms. Veena Kenchi (Politics and Public Administration department) and Dr. Meenal Sumant (Department of Economics) along with the History, Library department and Junior College section. The students were encouraged to read for gaining more knowledge. Countering the addiction to mobiles and online resources, students were introduced to digital reading apps. Dr. Sandhya Pandit (Dept. of History) used the 'Sanskriti Kosh' and demonstrated to students how to search for required information and ways of analysing historical data. Mrs. Vibha Rathod, Department of Hindi, Jr. College discussed with students the various Hindi authors and their writings. She also encouraged students to read passages from their favourite books and speak about their favourite poets. Mrs. Neena Dutta- (Dept. of English, Junior College) spoke about English literature and its role in enhancing knowledge and experience.

On this occasion books were displayed in the library on the lives of great personalities like Dr A P J Abdul Kalam, Vinda Karandikar in addition to other general reading books. Mrs Bhavkar, Dept. of Marathi, Jr. College spoke on the life of Dr A P J Abdul Kalam. Dr A P J Abdul Kalam Vachan Katta was installed for the readers. Mrs Devinder Kaur, the librarian, read out 7 quotes on Reading Inspiration, Asst. Librarian Mrs. Anadmayi Chounde recited poems composed by Vinda Karandikar and Mrs Madhuri Ghandat, Library staff, read out an article to the students on the importance of reading, written by Dr. K H Sancheti published in the Loksatta. Booklets written by Sadhu T L Vaswani and J P Vaswani were distributed to the students who visited the library on this occasion.

- An Inter-Departmental Contest titled- "Whittle, Paint and Win" was organized by the Dept. of Accountancy on

Saturday, 9th December, 2017, in which 34 teams from BA, B.Com, M. Com & BBA participated. The objective of the activity was to have a fun-filled event by using terms from their favourite subject and creating meaningful quotes relating to love, life, friendship, communication & values by painting them out on T-Shirts. The students created fabulous quotes and also showcased their excellent painting skills.

- Every year, the college organises a 'Soft Skills' workshop for the final year students of Arts and Commerce students to empower them and prepare them for the working world. What is taught goes beyond the realm of academic knowledge by giving the students that special 'X- factor' that makes all the difference when it comes to success in the wide world waiting for them beyond the college gates. Following topics were covered during this ten day workshop - Science of Positive Thinking, Communication, Interactions, Manners and Etiquettes, Stress Management, Assertiveness, Group Discussions and Interviews, Presentation Skills, Body language and Power dressing, Building Confidence and Dining etiquette and business etiquette. The two-day fest had competitions like Mad Ads, Team Building, Stand-up Comedy, Group Dance and Solo Dance. The overall winners of Spectrum 2017 was Christ College and the 1st Runner-up was Armed Forces Medical College(AFMC).

- **Teklogica 2017-18**

Like every year the Department of Computer Science organized an intercollegiate competition, "TEKLOGICA". Students of different colleges participated in an Electronics Project, Poster-making Competition, C Code Warrior, Statistics-Poster presentation, Math Aptitude Test, and other fun games.

Sayali Gawade and Owee Murhe participated in the Electronics project competition and their project was called RF Communication for which they won the 3rd prize.

Ribeka Lobo and Snehal Bhosale won the 2nd prize.

- **Exodus 2017-18**

On much-awaited morning of 28th November 2017, Exodus - the annual intercollegiate festival hosted by the BBA and BCA departments of St Mira's College for Girls, Pune commenced. The opening ceremony took place in the auditorium at 9 am. The 2-day event started with 'How Mad is your Ad', an event based on marketing and creativity skills. There were a lot of entertaining acts put up by the students of various colleges and the last event of the day 'Slammed' was hosted. Putting their thoughts into beautiful words and different languages, the students had composed their own poems. - A Marathi Cultural Programme titled 'Maharashtrachi Lokdhara' was held on Monday, 12th February, 2018 in which all the folk dances of Maharashtra were performed. Some students presented the different forms of Maharashtrian attire. The day was also celebrated across the college as Traditional Day.

- **Sadhu Vaswani Inter College Debate**

On the 31st of January, the Sadhu Vaswani Inter-College Debate Competition was co-ordinated by Suhaile Azavedo. The topic was "Censorship over Free Speech is justified in a diverse country like India" The judges were Mr. Suraj Sriram and Ms. Priyanka Menon. - **Constitution Day**

The Department of Politics and Public Administration celebrates the Constitution Day every year. This year Mrs. Anita D'Cunha organised a programme, wherein she reiterated the importance of the Constitution for the working of the Indian democracy. This was followed by students presentations about the exceptional contributions made by the women members of the Constituent Assembly. The programme concluded with the reading of the Preamble by the students in the assembly. The Library hosted an exhibition of the Constitution and related books.

- **Heritage walk of Mumbai and Pune city**

A Heritage Walk of the Fort Area of Mumbai was organized by the History department on 18th January, 2018 for TYBA students. The heritage walk covered about 12 sites and a distance of 3 kms. The sites were- CST, Asiatic Society Library, Lion Gate, Parsi Agiary, Hutatma Smarak, David Sassoon Library, Elphinstone College, Maharashtra State Archives, St. Thomas' Cathedral and the architecture of other buildings in the Fort area. The walk began at 10:30 a.m. and the guide Dr. Ranade explained to the students the history and architecture of these buildings mostly built by the British. The students were quite in awe of the architectural beauty and ornamentation of these heritage structures.

A heritage walk of Pune city was also organized on 10th February, 2018 - 'Freedom Trail'. This was a part of the annual Pune Heritage Festival organised by Janwani which the students participated in. The students were shown all the important sites dedicated to our freedom fighters and revolutionaries who contributed to the freedom struggle. Some of the sites they visited were Umaji Naik's smarak, Vasudev Balwant Phadke's smarak, Bhau Rangari's museum, the Tulsibaug temple, the Congress Bhavan, etc. It was a unique experience for the students as most of them had never known this part of Pune even existed. It gave the students an opportunity to witness and understand the kind of contribution made by these people and the significance of these sites in the history of Pune.

## IX. General Knowledge Test

A general knowledge test was conducted by the college on January 19, 2018. There were total 30 questions for the test constituting mathematical aptitude, logical reasoning, general knowledge, current affairs and English language. General knowledge team i.e. Dr. Mrs. Meenal Sumant, Ms. Deepa Krishnamurthy and Ms. Manjita Kulkarni contributed

#### X. Career Counselling and Placement Cell:

The Placement Cell of St. Mira's College has been actively involved in bringing about a match between the requirements of various companies and the students' interests, their abilities and potentials. The success of the Placement Cell lies in placing the right candidates, in the right jobs, at the right time.

The first half of the academic year had many orientations, on-campus and off-campus placement drives. An orientation programme was conducted by The Teach for India Fellowship Program, a soft skill development workshop was conducted by The Naandi Foundation - Mahindra Pride School and an orientation was conducted by Edwise Overseas Education Consultants for students. Three students, one from BCom and two from BA got an opportunity to participate in the Deakin interactive week to acquire a full scholarship for higher education at Deakin University, Australia. One of the students got selected for the 2nd round to be conducted in Delhi in June 2018.

# Report of Department Activities

## DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

**Ms. Madhuchhanda Banerjee (HoD), Dr. Snober Sataravala, Ms. Suhaile Azavedo, Ms. Komal Tujare, Ms. Roma Dar**

Every department at St Mira's strives to transform the students from awkward girls who are a little lost and confused to focussed determined young women who are aware that they must take their place in the world with responsibility. We believe that each student can go out and make a difference and we start that process here at Mira's. We began the year with:

- **Talks and Guest Lectures**

The Department of English organized a guest lecture on editing and writing for Wikipedia on the 15th of July 2017. Dr. Abhijeet Safai was invited for the lecture. Although a doctor involved in clinical research by profession, Dr. Safai has been actively editing articles on Wikipedia since 2011. He has also drafted about 90 new articles on the online encyclopaedia. The students were taught how to create an account for themselves to start editing and were encouraged to take on translation of English articles to regional languages which will help several non-English speaking Indians make use of the encyclopaedia. The lecture ended with an engaging question answer session.

A workshop on Advertising was conducted by Ms. Priyanka Menon on the 24th of July 2017. Ms. Menon, a writer and poet is also an advertising professional, whose area of expertise is copy writing, and is visiting faculty at several Media and Communication colleges in Pune. The primary objective of the workshop was to introduce the field of advertising and marketing to the students. She also broke down the entire process of ad - making right from receiving the brief, to brain storming, conceptualisation, analysis, copy-writing, art visualisation, to the first cut. Last but not least she gave the students key pointers on how to hone creativity and to build a career in the line.

On Tuesday 29th August 2019 Dr Swapna Nayudu addressed the students of the FYBA on 'Nehru and his Letters'. Dr Nayudu presently holds fellowships at the London School of Economics and Political Science, London, and also at the Centre for Policy Research, New Delhi. Dr Nayudu took her PhD King's College London and has presented her research in different capacities at the University of Cambridge and at Harvard University. She took the girls on a photographic journey which provided not just glimpses of the Nehru the man, but also how important his letters were in policy making and shaping the future of this nation.

As a policy we do not let go of our greatest assets which are our senior teachers. Dr. Mohini Khot who is the retired head of the department of English of St Mira's took a lecture with the SYBA Optional English class on the 9th of January where she explored the enchanting world of Jane Austen's *Pride and Prejudice*. The students were delighted by her in depth knowledge.

Whabiz Merchant Memorial Lecture VI<sup>th</sup> Edition- 20th January 2018. St Mira's College has a tradition of organising open free public lecture. This year Prof Merchant introduced the Whabiz Merchant Memorial Lecture with a beautiful poem he had dedicated to his sister who was no more. The series consists of 10 lectures all over the country where the first five are male speakers and the next five women. Thus St Mira's kicked of the second leg of the series. Suniti Namjoshi a renowned writer from the UK was an ex IAS officer who did her PhD on Ezra Pound. She read several of her stories which were delightful, humorous and yet profound. She talked about how the myths mutated over time and focussed on feminist reworking of some ancient myths like those from the *Panchatantra*, *Aesop Fables* and some ancient Greek myths.

- **Workshops**

Centre for Social Research (CSR), a non-profit organisation based in New Delhi, conducted a workshop at St. Mira's College on the 27th of July 2017. The workshop was conducted by Ms. Priyanka Londhe and Ms. Suhasini Mukherjee. This was the second year in succession that CSR was conducting the workshop at St. Mira's, sponsored by Facebook and Twitter. The primary objective was to educate youngsters on online safety especially on social network platforms.

A Drama Workshop was conducted by Mr. Suraj Parasnis and Mr. Virajas Kulkarni, co-founders of the theatre group Theatron. The workshop was organised to give the students an insight into the performative aspects of a play in addition to the textual aspects which are studied extensively in class. The workshop demonstrated the practical use of lights, sound, acting and the space of the stage in the making of a performance and it was a huge success with over 150 girls participating in it.

- **Field Visits**

Year in and year out we encourage our students to attend the Zee Jaipur Literature Fest as well as the Pune Literature Festival. This year is no different. They were blown away by Gulzar's poetry recitals and Mary Lamb's lectures. Lamb helped write I am Malala which is part of their syllabus.

### **Research Projects and Paper Presentation:**

#### **Teachers**

Ms Suhaile Azavedo is working hard at her PhD and Dr Snober Sataravala travelled to Kolkata, Delhi, Mumbai and Navsari interviewing eminent people and academicians for her ICSSR research project. Ms Komal Tujare will be going to Spain to present a paper at a conference titled 'Romantic E-scapes'.

#### **Students**

For their assignments, students wrote papers on the background, culture and comparison between various texts as well as movies. Research in literature is primarily library work. The students were oriented in putting down the outline of a paper to adding full citations to a paper.

- **Career Counselling**

The annual wall newspaper presented by the English Department was inaugurated on 1st August 2017 by the principal and the vice-principal. Articles were presented by the SYBA EM class. This year's newspaper was titled MirAge by the students.

A guest lecture on 'Journalism and Mass Media' was organized on 12th August 2017. Ms. Natasha Deboo (Communications Consultant, Forbes Marshall), was invited to address the girls on the various career options available to them in the field of communication and mass media. She patiently helped the students get a clear understanding of careers like editing, journalism, blogging, PR, HR, and photo-journalism among others.

On the 12th of December Harman Madan who has had 12 years experience both with the press as well as television spoke to the FYBA girls on 'Ethics in Media' as it is part of their curriculum. He also talked about the types of media and job opportunities available in those areas. He explained to the girls that economics, politics and entertainment are the three main driving forces that control the media.

- **Student Enrichment**

#### **Intra-department**

Performances of various plays like 'The Boor', 'An Interview with Murugesh Srikumar', *The Penelopiad*,



*Pygmalion* are essential not just to enhance understanding of the text but to encourage creativity and to build confidence amongst the students. As Shakespeare says, 'All the world's a stage...' and the sooner our girls learn to win people's hearts with powerful performances the better.

Songs, singing, karaoke and lip-sync performances are central to class activities. One assignment was to write the script to a music video and perform it which was a huge success. Senior students with guitar and bongo taught the juniors 'Imagine' by John Lennon and 'Blowing in the wind' by Bob Dylan. The classroom was turned into a veritable rock concert! For learning to be effective it must be fun and when work is fun it is more productive. The highly creative and enterprising students of F.Y.B.Com converted and enacted the narrative ballad, *Lochinvar* by Sir Walter Scott into a successful play with believable character backgrounds and motivations. The students of SYBA participated enthusiastically in an intra-class poetry recitation competition in which they performed any one poem of their choice from the syllabus and the winner was chosen by the entire class through a vote.

### Intra-college

- On Tuesday, 11th July 2017, CEO of a multi-national company Extensia, Chetan Shetty spoke to the girls of the FY, SY and TYBA about the importance of English, creativity and ideation. He spoke to them about internship opportunities available at his company and what he was looking for. We are proud to mention one of our girls got selected as an intern and started work there on 16th Oct 2017. He then elaborated on the ancient art of storytelling as part of Indian culture and its importance in society. This was followed by a spellbinding narration of the thought provoking story 'Nagamandala' based on the play by eminent actor, director and playwright Girish Karnad.
- A Debate Club was initiated, on the 21st of July, to hone the talents of our many young debaters from all streams. The club aimed to meet bi-monthly but fired by the youngsters' enthusiasm met every week. Trending topics, extempore debates with rebuttals and heated discussions were regular incidences during sessions. Girls were also introduced to the formal aspects of competitions, dos and don'ts of good debating. Several students participated and won prizes in intercollegiate debate competitions.

The annual English Declamation Competition was organized on the 26th and 28th of July 2017 in honour of Dada J.P. Vaswani's 99th birthday. A total of 19 girls participated with great enthusiasm and eloquently declaimed passages from the works of Dada Vaswani. The competition was judged by Ms. Shalini Iyer and Ms. Abhradita Chatterjee on Day 1 and Mrs. Shalini Iyer and Ms. Elizabeth Kanade on Day 2. The winners of the competition were as follows:

On the 8th of August 2017, 2 pm in the A.V. Room, the students inaugurated the literature club known as The Litwits a venture by the students to ensure that all students from all streams enjoy contemporary young literature in a non-academic way. To set the ball rolling Dr. Snober Sataravala invited Karthik Rajan a young but nevertheless famous slam poet who compered for international artists like Sarah Kay and has had been an invited speaker on a TEDx Talk. Some of our students read their poems as well.

- The movie *Miss Peregrine's Home for Peculiar Children* was screened by The Litwits on the 24th of August 2017. The students voted for the movie to be screened and it enabled the students to get together and manage all the bookings for the screening after getting permission from the required authorities. The members also advertised the film in various classes in order to gather more viewers. The students learnt to be organized and overcome all obstacles that one faces when taking on leadership roles.
- The Litwits organised a flash mob on the 14th of September 2017. More than 150 girls participated in the impromptu flash mob which attracted students and faculty members from all the streams to gather in the central courtyard of the college during the break to dance and release all their negativity and tension. The activity was

organised as a stress buster for all the members of the Mira family and it not only brought everyone closer but also added a lot of joy and frolic to the campus.

- An initiative to paint the college canteen was taken up by the members of The Litwits. A total of 15 girls got together and decided to spend their Diwali break painting the college canteen. The girls planned and executed every aspect of the activity right from the outline of the budget to the actual painting of the walls. The end result was appreciated by everyone and it inspired other students to also give back to the college in their own way.
- Prashanti Cancer Care Mission as a fund raiser brought down the play *Three Women* a musical theatre written and directed by Isheetta Ganguly starring Avantika Akerkar, Mahnaz Damania and Chrisann Pereira, on the 16th of September 2017. The play captured a saucy, satirical spin on the lives of three of Rabindranath Tagore's women. The students of St Mira's were part of the cancer awareness drive.
- In anticipation of a live musical enactment of an assigned course text, *Romeo and Juliet* by William Shakespeare, the students assembled into a choir conducted and coordinated by Ms. Roma Dar. Over 25 dedicated students participated throughout the duration of the course. The choir training was held over a span of 5 months, from July to December 2017. Students learnt the basics of and had practical exposure to choral performance and musical coordination, breathing techniques and teamwork through the experience. Students also learnt to perform, and actively contributed to the benefit of three and four part harmony in the songs "All of me" by John Legend, and "Love Story" by Taylor Swift.
- *A Musical Adaptation: Romeo and Juliet: 22nd Dec 2017*

The students in the TYBA optional English class study the famous tragedy by Shakespeare called Romeo and Juliet. This inspired an ambitious plan that involved a hundred students from the college across all streams. They helped script the play, design tickets, market and sell them so as to have two shows both running to full houses. They then designed backdrops which they painted and scanned onto giant LED screen. Another team did the makeup for the performers, others sold snacks at the beginning and end of the play, ushered about nine hundred people to their seats to ensure that the show went off smoothly. They handled the sound, lights in addition to those that danced, acted and sang in a modern day adaptation of the play that was truly an extravaganza. Two shows were performed to a full house and it truly was a memorable experience. The video was uploaded on YouTube for all to see.

Apart from time management, responsibility, team work, confidence building and creativity a hundred students from all walks of life got a taste of what it feels like to be a star and no experience compares with that.

### Inter-college

Swathi Satish, Shreya Humnabadkar, Ananya, Sudipta Dasand, Fatema Lightwala from SYBcom, SYBA and FYBA, all active contributors to the debate club represented the college at the Christ College, Symbiosis College and the AIT debate competitions. They won prizes and received notable appreciation.

On the 31st of January the Sadhu Vaswani Inter-College Debate Competition was co-ordinated by Suhaile Azavedo. The topic was "Censorship over Free Speech is justified in a diverse country like India".

### Movie Screenings

Movies are a central part of education in literature because they allow a visual introduction to worlds that are culturally different. We show performances of plays like *The Penelopiad*. Apart from that we show advertisements like the Nike ad 'Da Da Ding' to explain the use of myth. They watched *The Dead*, *Romeo + Juliet*, *Equus*, *Bladerunner*, *Pride and Prejudice*, Peter Brook's *Mahabarata* and innumerable documentaries and powerpoint presentations. A screening of a BBC documentary film on the partition of India, *The Day India Burned* was held on 11th August 2017 as part of the Independence week celebration. The documentary also correlates to the FY syllabus, specifically to the prescribed novel *Train to Pakistan*. Science students watched and discussed the movie and

character of Jobs, other B.Com pupils watched The Gift of the Magi and speeches by Malala Yousafzai. My Fair Lady an adaptation of *Pygmalion* was screened for students from FYBA and FYB.Com.

- **Consultancy:**

Suhaile Azavedo and Dr Snober Sataravala both were invited speakers at Gyan Adab, a cultural centre of the city. The former spoke on Hamlet and the latter on Romeo and Juliet. Both lectures were attended by people from all over the city.

## DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY

**Dr. Vaishali Diwakar (HOD), Dr. Vaishali Joshi, Ms. Manjita Kulkarni**

- **Guest Lecture**

On 5th July, Ms. Sneha Gole from Women's Studies Center, SPPU, conducted a session on 'Gender and Culture' for F. Y. students. She explained the difference between sex and gender and gender as a social construct. She focused on the close link between gender and culture and explained how culture refers to the construction of every-day life. Ms. Gole had an open dialogue with the students, encouraged them to share their every day experiences and helped them to see how gender operates in our choices, attitudes, opinions and decisions. This session was also very helpful in orienting students about the general misconceptions of gender and gendering.

On 6th September Mrs. Sadhana Kulkarni conducted a session for BA and MA Sociology students on 'Regionalism'. Mrs. Kulkarni spoke about the regionalism within Maharashtra, the uneven distribution of resources, uneven growth of agriculture, politics of financial aid and lack of political will. She also spoke about the language issues at border areas and traced some of the issues since the formation of Maharashtra. After giving the regional perspective, Mrs. Kulkarni spoke about the regionalism at the national level. She mainly highlighted the issues of secessionist movement and the formation of separate states.

On 16th January, 2018 the department organized a guest lecture on 'Volunteering in an initiative to transform education practices' by Mr. Dalmia from TickLinks. TickLinks is a voluntary initiative started by Mr. Dalmia in 2016. The students responded spontaneously and 6 students registered as volunteers for this work.

Pratima Pardeshi was invited to speak on "student movements in India" on 24th January 2018. Initially she gave the brief review of the introduction of Indian history and the place of students in it. While doing that, she explained the Brahmanical perspective on education. She also discussed about the colonial rule and their teaching methods. She also explained how they used education as their tool for development. Pardeshi also talked about the emergence of student's movement in 19th century and the progress of student movements and the changing nature of student movements. She had categorized these movements in Marxist view(left wing), Dalit, Satyashodhak, Right wing and explained the changing nature of student movement related with ideology. Lastly Pratima talked about the challenges in front of these movements especially after globalization.

- **Field visit**

- ◆ River walk

In coordination with JivitNadi foundation, the department organized a field visit to Mutha river on 12th August 2017. JivitNadi foundation works for the awareness of water conservation, restoring health of the rivers and other live sources of water. Under this project they conduct a 'river walk' on Mutha river at Omkareshwar temple. Through this walk the volunteers of JivitNadi made our students familiar with the rich history associated with Mutha river, the life in Mutha river, Peshwa heritage and their association with river and the life around river, relations with historical events, humans and environmental chain of river. The volunteers through images and historical monuments, actually shown our students the historical markers existing till date. They also gave information about flora and fauna and the need for its conservation. It was a very enlightening experience for students.

- ◆ Field visit to Lavasa

The field visit to Lavasa was organized on 22nd January 2018 to introduce students to the concept of displacement. Students could interact with adivasi families and could talk to them about the big projects and their consequences for the poor, corruption and illegal constructions. It was an eye opener visit for SYBA students.

- ◆ Field visit to SEDT, Parbhani

The department organized 3 days study tour to the Socio Economic Development Trust (SEDT), Kerawadi, Dist. Parbhani from 18th to 20th January 2018. The purpose of the visit was to introduce students to village social life and to acquaint them with the NGO working in the area of child rights. During this visit students interacted with farmers, rural women, adolescent girls in villages and interacted with the orphan children residing at SEDT. These three day long interaction with various different age groups and their realities was a life changing experience for the students.

- **Workshop**

- ◆ Lokayat conducted a workshop on Eve teasing through films on 28th August 2017. The team from Lokayat mainly focused on issues of masculinities, boy's attitude and consequences of eve teasing. During the interactive session, the team challenged many myths operating in the society like girl's provocative dressing encourages sexual crimes related to women in our society. The workshop also included the screening of documentaries on eve teasing and the consequences for girls. The documentaries also helped students to see reality especially when many girls have to leave their education because of the eve teasing. The last part of the workshop consisted a brain storming session with students to find out the solutions to reduce the incidents and the methods to reorient the boys to rethink the concept of masculinity.

- ◆ Sociology department of St Mira's college for girls organized a workshop on sexuality by Tathapi, NGO working in the health sector on 12th January 2018. The workshop discussed various issues like body shaming, menstruation, unsafe sex etc. The workshop really got students exposed to various topics which are never spoken about.



- ◇ The workshop on 'Multidimensional Skills' was arranged by the Sociology Department of St Mira's College for girls on 13th Decemebr 2017. Mr. Pitam Tiwari highlighted the importance of multidimensional skills in today's world. He elaborated on the "No excuse, No complaint, No regret" formula for successful living. He introduced a very interesting concept of pitstop. Through this concept he highlighted the importance of taking a pause in our lives and introspect and build on our strengths further.
- ◇ On 5th February a workshop on "gender and public spaces: safety mapping and beyond" was conducted by Sneha Gole and Deepa Tak of the KSP Women's Studies Centre, SPPU. The workshop discussed the issue of safety of women and tried to critically map the different discourses around it. Through discussions around film clippings etc. it was argued that while safety is an important issue for women, often discourses of safety focus on maintaining sexual purity of women. Thus, the discourse of safety instead of being located within the framework of equal access to public spaces and equal rights as citizens, gets articulated within a framework of izzat, modesty and sexual purity of women. The students also did safety mapping of their own spaces, including the roads leading to the college, their neighbourhoods etc. to identify the contexts, people, places which are unsafe/ make them uncomfortable/ are seen as risky. Through the role playing exercises, a discussion was initiated around what women can do if they find themselves in vulnerable situations, how they can plan for their own safety. Through the discussions, the issue of exhibitionism, of men masturbating in the lanes around Bund Garden was highlighted, as an experience many girls faced.
- ◇ Dept of Sociology conducted a workshop on Voice as career. Mr. Pritam Tiwari Director, gave an orientation into various voice modulations to show how trained a voice can be effectively used in various fields like anchoring, animation, dubbing and as radio jockey. He also explained the importance of understanding the science of voice and voice as an art and demonstrated how to produce audio works by actually recording, editing and mixing

- **Research Projects**

In collaboration with AIDWA, TY sociology students conducted a survey on "The Impact of Television Serials on Working Class Women". Students generated the questionnaire and each student collected data from Yerawada, Vishrantwadi, Camp areas as a part of their Research Methodology project.

Our MA student is working on a research project on Non water Sanitation project with a NGO based in Berlin.

- **Movie Screening**

As a part of their classroom activities students watched following films: *Listen Amaya*, *Ki and Ka*, Documentary on sociological imagination, *Fandry*, *Hindi Medium*, *Stepford Wives*, Film on Jyotiba Phule- *Bharat ki Khoj*, *Saathsaath*, *Monster in Law*, *Mississippi Masala*, *Working Class goes to Paradise*.



## DEPARTMENT OF PSYCHOLOGY

**Dr. Jaya Rajagopalan (HOD), Mrs. Sharmin Palsetia**

The department of Psychology organized various activities for the academic year 2017-18. The activities included guest lectures, workshops, field visits, movie screenings, extension activities and opportunities for internships.

### Guest Lectures

- A Guest lecture was conducted on 22nd February 2018 on Scope of Industrial/Organizational Psychology. The lecture was facilitated by Mr. Syed Abdussalam, Manager, Leadership Development Team, Avaya India Pvt. Ltd. The lecture covered topics like career options, opportunities, approximate salary packages and growth in the field of I/O psychology.
- A Guest lecture was conducted on 23rd February 2018 on Scope of Clinical Psychology. The lecture was facilitated by Ms. Vasima Bhagat, Practicing Clinical psychologist. The lecture covered topics that included the courses, career options, opportunities and growth in the field of Clinical Psychology.

### Workshops

- As a part of "Peer Training Program" the students of T.Y.B.A. conducted a Stress Management workshop for S.Y.B.A. (Psychology) students on 10th July 2017. The session started with the ice breaker game titled "Fruit Salad". Recall of positive and negative events in their lives, practical demonstration of Pranayam and relaxation techniques, and role plays based on problem solving were included in the session.
- The S.Y.B.A (Psychology) students underwent a Training Session for Peer Counselling Program on 31st July 2017 which was facilitated by the T.Y.B.A volunteers, wherein they trained the students in conducting stress management workshops for the students of other streams as well. During the training, the T.Y.B.A. students discussed the important aspects of the workshop. The students were provided with the script to guide relaxation in the participants and were given insight into the role of the facilitator.
- Memory Improvement Techniques were introduced to the TYBA (Psychology) students on 12th August 2017. The workshop was facilitated by Ms. Harkirat Kaur Arora, an alumna of the Department of Psychology. Ms. Harkirat is a Behavioural Analyst and a Psychologist at Sproutlogix Pvt. Ltd. The workshop included activities in the context of various memory improvement techniques. These activities helped the students to understand the kind of technique that would be best suited to their individual learning styles.
- On 26th August 2017 from 10am to 11.30am a Yoga session was conducted by Miss Swaruti Tamang, who is also an alumna of the college and a trained Yoga practitioner. She introduced and demonstrated relaxation techniques like Instant Relaxation Technique, Quick Relaxation Technique and Deep Relaxation Technique. The students then practised the relaxation techniques for 45 minutes. The feedback about the session was extremely positive.
- A workshop on Improving Attention Span was organized for TYBA (Psychology) students on 12th August 2017. The workshop was facilitated by Ms. Harkirat Kaur Arora, The workshop included an introduction to types of attention and how to sustain attention over a long period of time. It also included activities based on the techniques like Magic Word, Role Play, Park Your Thoughts and Self-Assessment exercises.
- Mrs. Prachi Deo, Founder, Nayi Disha Resource Centre introduced the students to Directory Building for Special Needs Children on 2nd September 2017. Nayi Disha Resource Centre is an online information resource platform that supports families of persons with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD). The founding team includes parents and siblings of individuals with IDD, who understand the challenges and

needs faced by other similar families. Mrs. Prachi Deo explained to the students the severe dearth of relevant information for parents with special needs children. Hence, the NGO has taken an initiative in creating a directory of all the professionals who deal with special needs children. The students of St. Mira's will be the volunteers to generate the lead data and conduct surveys for creating the directory in Pune city. The students were enthusiastic and grateful to be a part of such a noble initiative.

- A workshop on Sensitization to Disabilities was held on 9th September 2017. The workshop was facilitated by Mrs. Anita Iyer, Founder and Managing Trustee, Ekansh Trust. The team at Ekansh believes that any disability, physical or mental, needs to be understood holistically. Therefore, they have followed the sequence of Awareness, Acceptance, Sensitization and Inclusion of people with disabilities in areas of education and employment. The workshop commenced with a talk by Ms. Isha who suffered from Brittle Bone Disease and shared the kind of struggle she faced. This was followed by an introduction to Ekansh Trust which was given by Mrs. Anita Iyer. The workshop had various activities where the students had to use the wheelchair, walk with a blindfold and a stick, identifying various shapes and structures with a blindfold etc. Mrs. Anita also introduced the basics of Sign language to the students. Through the workshop the students realized the day-to-day struggles that the people with disabilities face.
- As a part of "Peer Training Program" the students of T.Y.B.A. conducted the Stress Management workshop for FYBBA(CA) and FYBA students on 6th and 7th February 2018.

### **Field Visits**

- A field trip was organized for the SYBA Psychology Special students to KEM Hospital's Infant Testing Centre (TDH Centre) on 24th August 2017 to gain insight into infant testing for psychological and neurological disorders. This visit helped the students to learn about the various Diagnostic and Therapeutic Services available at the centre for all the disabilities. The students got to learn about the functioning of some departments at TDH like- the Audiology Department (Big Ears), Counseling Cell, Play therapy Cell, Occupational Therapy Cell. The students also got an opportunity to interact with the experts in the area of Speech therapy, Occupational therapy, Audiology etc. They particularly interacted with various Social workers and Dr. Deshpande (the Clinical psychologist). Dr. Deshpande helped the students to gain insight into the testing of the Developmental Quotient (DQ).
- The students of SYBA (Psychology) visited Mukttangan De-addiction Centre on 24th August 2017. The purpose of the visit to Mukttangan de-addiction Centre was to understand the role of a residential rehabilitative de-addiction centre. The students were given an overview about the process of addiction with an emphasis on the physical, emotional and social consequences.
- They also visited Schizophrenia Awareness Association (SAA) on 29th August 2017. The purpose of the visit to SAA was to sensitize the students to the lives of patients with schizophrenia. Talks with the caretakers gave the students an understanding of the symptoms treatment and rehabilitation efforts for the disorder of schizophrenia. Another visit was to Prasanna Autism Centre on 21st September 2017. The purpose of the visit was to understand interventions in the area of developmental disorders, namely autism. The interactions with the centre director facilitated the student's understanding of the role of teachers and shadow teachers, training to improve social interactions, eye contact, proper speech, solve motor movement issues etc. for children on the autism spectrum.
- These field visits enabled the students to understand the role of such centres and the different therapies and support systems that work effectively in rehabilitation of the patients of psychological disorders.

### **Research Projects and Paper Presentation**

- Mrs. Sharmin Palsetia presented a paper titled "Enhancing the Quality of Life of the Employees through Employee Assistance Programs" in a 2-day National seminar on Quality of Life: Concept, Measurement and Enhancement at Jnana Prabhodhini's Institute of Psychology, Pune on 17th and 18th November, 2017.



Mrs. Sharmin Palsetia presented a paper titled "A Case Study on Employee Engagement Factors to Generate a Predictive Retention Model" in 1<sup>st</sup> Indian Congress of Industrial and Organizational Psychology, Jaipur on 30th and 31st January, 2018.

### Counselling

- An orientation to the Counselling Cell was organized on 3rd July, 2017 during the sanctuary, wherein all the students were informed about the functioning of the Counselling Cell. The students were sensitized to the need for reaching out for their problems in emotional difficulties, decision making, relationship issues, issues with parents or deciding which career to pursue etc. The counseling cell is open to all the students on an appointment basis.

### Movie Screening

- *One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest* was screened for the SYBA Psychology students on 14th July 2017. This activity enabled the SYBA Psychology students to critically analyze themes based on psychopathology depicted in the movie. Students evaluated the movie along the supernatural and biological traditions and understood their influence in the development, maintenance and treatment of mental illness. It provided the students with better insight into these two perspectives.
- *Legally Blonde* was screened for the SYBA psychology students on 6th September 2017 from 10 am to 11.30am as a part of their Social Psychology assignment to help them understand the concepts of stereotypes, prejudice and discrimination.

### Student Enrichment

- As a part of students enrichment we provide various internship opportunities to our students. The students are currently interning at Intelligence Plus Pvt. Ltd. and Just Being Centre. The founders of the organization are extremely happy with the sincerity, dedication and the knowledge-base of the students.

### Talks and Guest Lectures

- 22.07.2017 - S.Y.B.A. - Guest Lecture on 'Socialism' by Dr. Vaishali Joshi, Dept. of Sociology, St. Mira's College for Girls, Pune
- 18.12.2017 - T.Y.B.A. - Guest Lecture on 'History of Hindustani Classical Music' by Dr. Vaishali Joshi, Dept. of Sociology, St. Mira's College for Girls, Pune - to introduce the students to the rich culture of India in a performing art like music. This lecture helped students understand the nuances of classical music and the tradition and contribution of different gharanas to Indian culture.
- 20.02.2018 - Degree College and Junior College students - Guest Lecture on 'The Renaissance in Europe' by Dr. Rekha Ranade, ex-Head and Professor, Department of History, University of Pune, Pune - This was a lecture which was requested and demanded by the students themselves out of their interest in the European Renaissance even though this topic is not a part of their syllabus. This lecture received an overwhelming response from the students who not only got a definite understanding of why the renaissance took place with Italy as its seat but also a detailed insight into the contribution of various artists and scholars in the fields of literature, painting, sculpture, architecture and science. It was an audio-visual presentation which helped the students give faces to popular names in renaissance like Leonardo da Vinci, Michelangelo, Petrarch, etc. and also get a glimpse of the magnanimity of the work that was done by these writers and artists.
- 23.02.2018 - F.Y.B.A. - Guest Lecture on 'The Legacy of the Ancient Greek Architecture' by Architect Dr. Vaishali Latkar, Head of the Conservation Department, Sinhadgad College of Architecture, Pune - This lecture helped the students get an insight into the connection between the climate, geography, lifestyle and culture of the Greeks and the development of their architecture. The visual images shown gave the students a deeper understanding of the kind of architecture that developed in ancient Greece, the mathematical calculations and engineering concepts used and how the technique of optical illusion was used to give a perfectly balanced and symmetrical view of their buildings especially the Parthenon temple. It started with an interactive session wherein the speaker made the students think and taught them how to link natural factors to the development of any culture.
- 07.03.2018 - S.Y.B.A. - Guest Lecture on 'The Emergence and Politics of the European Union' by Professor Neha Agashe, Department of Political Science, Symbiosis College of Arts and Commerce - This lecture helped the students understand the need for formation of the European Union and the role it plays in international politics. The speaker also discussed Brexit which the students quite enjoyed.

### Workshops

#### Workshop on UPSC/MPSC and Bank Exams -

- A workshop was organised by the Departments of History, Economics, and Politics and Public Administration

on an introduction to civil service exams like UPSC, MPSC and Bank Probationary Officers exams in association with Unique Academy, Pune. The workshop was attended by more than 200 students from Arts and Commerce. Students were introduced to the significance of these exams, the different levels of papers to be attempted and the strategies that can help them in clearing these exams. The speakers, Mr. Kazi and his colleague also focused on the career opportunities for students on clearing these exams.

### **Field Visits**

- 14.12.2017 - T.Y.B.A. - Visit to the Aradhana Institute of Dance, Pune - The idea was to introduce the students to the creative world of classical dances, which is a part of their syllabus on Indian Culture and Heritage. Being fully aware that this knowledge and the pure essence of these dances cannot be imparted to the students within the four walls of our classroom, we knocked the doors of this Bharatanatyam Academy. Even at 79 years of age, the founder Guru Prerna Desai introduced the students to the world of spirituality and the practice of Bharatanatyam as a spiritual art form with great finesse. 'Dadima's' performance in the end mesmerized us all and left us in complete awe of her persona teaching the students valuable lessons in the three D's - discipline, dedication and devotion.
- 18.12.2017 - F.Y.B.A. - Visit to the Tribal Art and Culture Museum, Pune - The students were introduced to the art and culture of various tribes in Maharashtra. They were quite enthralled by the detailed and skilful craftsmanship of the tribal people evident through their works on display at the museum. The students got an idea of how the life of the tribal people is intertwined with their crafts and reflects their culture.
- 18.01.2018 - T.Y.B.A. - Educational Visit to the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalay (CSMVS), Mumbai to see a special exhibition on 'India and the World: A History in Nine Stories' which was a rare opportunity for the students. It was a landmark exhibition presented as a collaboration between CSMVS, the British Museum in London and the National Museum, New Delhi, with the support of the Ministry of Culture. The exhibition showcased around 200 most important objects and works of art from the Indian Subcontinent, in dialogue with iconic pieces from the British Museum collection - from sculptures to inscriptions, coins, paintings and much more. These objects were linked together to help us understand our history and explore where we are today.

The exhibition was spread over nine sections - Shared Beginnings, First Cities, Empire, State and Faith, Picturing the Divine, Indian Ocean Traders, Court Cultures, Quest for Freedom and Time Unbound. It presented small groups of objects from key periods in history in conversation with each other. It highlighted the strong connections India has shared historically with the rest of the world, promoting an exchange of ideas and influences that have helped create a global culture.

- Students : Students of FYBA were counselled based on their performance in the First Semester of the F.Y.B.A. course. Based on the difficulties that they shared, efforts were taken to help the students on improving their



performance in exams in the second semester.

## Student Enrichment

### Intra-department

- 14.07.2017 - A display of Prehistoric and Egyptian artefact was brought for the F.Y.B.A. students to give them a real time feel of the culture of the time periods which they are studying. The prehistoric artefacts enhanced their knowledge of carbon dating and the stone tools used in those days.

The Egyptian period paintings on papyri awed the students with the bright colours used and the experience of actually touching and feeling the papyrus sheets transformed them back in time and they were awe-struck by the skill of the Egyptian people. The students were mesmerised with their sculptural and architectural wonders of the busts of Tutenkhamen, Cleopatra, the Pyramids, obelisk, etc.

- 21.07.2017 - Rimsha Qureshi, an S.Y.B.A. student showed a movie on the life of their Prophet, which was shot in Egypt. This was an initiative by her to show this to the F.Y.B.A. students who are studying the Egyptian civilization as a part of their syllabus. Rimsha, very meticulously sat through the entire movie and marked out the parts from the movie relevant to the students. She added commentaries to help the students understand the Egyptian culture through their lifestyle, monuments, paintings, working of the spinning of cloth, etc. as shown in the movie. This gave the students an opportunity to witness the contemporary realities of life in Ancient Egypt. This effort was much appreciated and enjoyed by the students.

## Movie Screenings

- 10.07.2017 - S.Y.B.A. - A documentary on 'The French Revolution' by BBC was screened for the students to enhance their understanding of the contemporary situation in France which led to the revolution.
- 24.07.2017 - F.Y.B.A. - Two documentaries on 'The Egyptian Civilization' by BBC titled 'Discovery of Tutankhamen's Tomb' and 'The Rosetta Stone' were screened for the students. The first documentary showed the students the actual locales of the pyramids, the tombs, the excavation process followed, the anxiety and excitement of having discovered something as significant as the tomb. The second documentary showed the students the writings on the Papyri, the hieroglyphic script of the Egyptians and its decipherment by the French and the efforts and dedication of scholars towards research.
- 13.12.2017 - S.Y.B.A. - A movie 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas' was screened. This movie is set against the horror of the Holocaust. It gives the students an idea of the terror, ruthlessness and fear during Hitler's reign in Germany. The boy's inability to comprehend prejudice and killing, and his instinctive and uncomplicated ability to see Jews as real human beings starkly contrast Nazi cruelty. A German child's purity and naiveté starkly contrasts with his Nazi father's heartlessness, bringing the horror of the Holocaust into focus through an innocent's eyes.
- 19.01.2018 - S.Y.B.A. - A documentary on 'History of the Cold War' - The struggle between communism and capitalism defined the second half of the 20th Century. The Cold War pitted east against west, pushing the world to the brink of a nuclear war. This documentary gave the students a better idea of the situation prevalent in Europe after the Second World War. Original archived footage also gave them an insight into the realities of international politics.
- 05.03.2018 - S.Y.B.A. - A documentary on 'From World War II to the European Union' - Against the recent background of 'Brexit' there was a lot of curiosity aroused among students regarding the emergence and work of the EU. Since it is also a part of their syllabus, this documentary gave them an overview of the emergence of the EU and the different bodies existing in it and the need for a separate union like this in Europe.

### Talks and Guest Lectures:

On 19th July 2017, the Departments of Economics organised a Guest Lecture on 'Health and Youth' by Dr. Medha Sarsambi. ### **Workshops were organised on :**

'Creativity' by Dr.(Mrs.) Chitra Sohani, a Trainer at the Birla Education Initiative, Pune. In a highly interactive session, through different examples and exercises students were exposed to the importance of creativity in today's changing scenario.

A follow up activity of the workshop on 'Creativity' was organised to give students hands on experience on making things out of waste, culminating in an exhibition of the different items like flower vases, show pieces, wall hangings, pen stands, table lamps etc. created from old bottles, Pepsicans, CDs, newspapers, cardboard boxes etc.

- The students visited Bhimtadi Jatra, an annual fair which helped them to get practical insights on the formation, functioning and funding of Self Help Groups.

### **Department of Law organized Guest Lectures on :**

- 'Standard Form Contracts' and 'Types of Contracts'. The expert speaker, advocate Mr. Shailendra Pathak addressed the students with practical insights and facts related to Law. He explained the types of contracts and the remedies on breach, facilitated by real life examples.
- 'Corporate Fraud Investigations' by Chartered Accountant Mr. Akshay Oke. who explained the meaning of the term "fraud", giving an account of statistics relating to corporate frauds in India and applicable laws within and outside India. Further, the provisions of the New Companies Act, 2013 relating to frauds and fraud reporting was touched upon. Factors facilitating frauds was also a part of the session.
- Exhibition on 'Know Your Laws', was organized to create awareness regarding various Business and Labour Laws. The exhibition focused on women rights and showcased a Street Play along with posters on Commercial Laws, Labour Laws and Glossary of Legal Terms. Also, a video of various laws and a power point on a dictionary of legal terms to create awareness was shown.

### Talks and Guest Lectures

Ms. Snehal Gaikwad and Ms. Mansi Sail our Cost and Works Accounting Students shared their experience about the CMA Course which included explanation about how students can pursue CMA and its scope in the future. They shared about various levels, subjects included at each level and the exam patterns of CMA.

The students were informed about the registration procedure and when it can be opted for. This was followed by a question-answer session. The session gave an insight about Cost Management Accountant (CMA) as a career option.

The lecture helped the students to take a stock of individual goals, failures and purpose of one's life, to explore the hidden talents and develop them, to dream big and achieve it through hard work, passion and focus, to account for the valuable lessons learn from mistakes committed and the Do's and Don'ts of Social Media.
- On 20th January, 2018 a power packed session on 'Teaching as a Career Option- a GPS for clearing the NET and SLET' examination was organised for vocational courses faculty, M.A, M.Com and T.Y. students. The Costing Students of S.Y.B.Com under the guidance and assistance of Prof. Dimple Buche went on an Industrial Visit to Pravin Masalewale, Yawat Plant on 20th December, 2017. Students got a practical insight on how an Organization works, requirements of the 3Ms: Material, Man Power and Machine; the Hierarchy of the Organization; the combined use of Manual Recording of Attendance and Electronic Access Control. The Head of Inventory Store gave the students a practical insight into determining Material Requirement of a Product, Issuing Purchase Order, Material Quality Inspection System Red-White-Green colour coding, Inventory of Materials to be used for Production and making sure the rate of normal loss of Raw Material is low (approx. 20%). The students were able correlate the theoretical concepts they had studied with the practices being carried out by the company.

### Guest Lectures

- Digital Transformation - BCA - 18/7/17

The guest lecture was organized by NIIT for BCA and BBA second year and final year students. It covered topics like Big data and Cloud Computing. The lecture conducted also gave information on various, career opportunities available for DT Professionals.

- GST (Goods and Services Tax) - 20th JULY 2017

Speaker - Aparna Thadani - Practicing CA and Partner Enroll Proficiency Edusys.

With the introduction of the biggest revolutionary tax reform India has seen since Independence, to educate girls and make them up to date with this most recent change, a guest lecture was organised for FY/SY/TYBBA. GST, is generally misunderstood by a majority of the population as they think of it as an additional tax, instead of a replacement of all the indirect taxes one has to pay. Therefore, GST tends to be looked down upon. Ms. Thadani started off her lecture by clearing this misconception. Her lecture was thoroughly organised and followed a structured timeline. She started off by explaining the pre-GST scenario to the girls, so they'd have a clearer understanding of the changes that GST has brought about.

- Entrepreneur Development- 26th July 2017

Speaker - Ms Sabiha Fazalbhoy - Entrepreneurship Management Professional at the Symbiosis Centre for Management Studies.

Sabiha Fazalbhoy introduced the key role of establishing entrepreneurship as a stream specialisation. She gave an insight to the students of TYBBA and TYBCom with an hour-long session that was based on Ideation and Ideation Generation. She divided the session into two main segments - the first segment highlighted the stages of idea generation and the second segment focused on the techniques of ideation.

Ms. Sabiha Fazalbhoy blurred the line between the two parts of the session by stating some facts about idea generation in the hope that the girls would get inspired and confident to face their own ideas. She believes that an idea can come to an individual irrespective of education, social class, intellect level, etc., and no idea is a bad idea. All ideas are of the same quality, until matched up with the opportunity. Ms. Fazalbhoy stated that a business of a good market value is a result of a perfect match between the idea and the opportunity in the market.

- Intellectual Property Rights- 18th September 2017

Speaker - Advocate Shailendra Pathak for TYBBA

A guest lecture was organized for the students of TYBBA on the topic Intellectual Property Rights. The guest lecture was delivered by Advocate Shailendra Pathak - an expert in intellectual property. He has many accomplishments, including BSL LLM (Pune University) and a Diploma in Cyber Laws. With his expertise lying in the fields of Corporate Contracts, International Law, Intellectual Property Management, and consultation, Mr. Pathak was able to give the students relevant and first-hand examples.

- How to Write a Report/Project - 16th January 2018

Speaker - Ms Farhat Ajajan - Freelance Trainer

A guest lecture on research report writing was organised for TYBBA students. The lecture was taken by Ms Farhat Ajajan alumna of St Mira's college. She started her session with an interactive activity called brainstorming of research topics related to HR, Marketing and Finance. She explained sampling techniques by giving a few examples and tips on how to go ahead with our research topic. Later she began with the process of research and the format to be followed. She explained on what basis a questionnaire must be made. The concept of plagiarism was explained in detail. A research report should be clear, honest, and accurate. The structure and format of research report was discussed. From her personal experience a few difficulties were pointed out while doing a project and a few tips were given. At the end, question answer session was kept so that students could ask any queries related to their research topic. All students appreciated the session and expressed that the session was very helpful.

- Latest Trends in HRM - 23rd January 2018

Speaker - Asst. Prof Nishant Khandelwal - Symbiosis Centre for Management Studies

A guest lecture on the topic "New trends in HR (FLEXIBLE DREAMS) was organised for HR students of TYBBA. The lecture was delivered by Prof. Nishant Khandelwal who is a professor at Symbiosis college Pune. Before the lecture began he put forth three conditions in front of students i.e 100% participation, enthusiasm and trust. In his presentation he started with a small story of his personal experience. He asked them to share any

20 words that attracted them or live with them like mobile, music etc. He that an HR must be well updated about the changing requirements of employees, their likes and dislikes. He spoke about the current scenario in HR, best workplace characteristics, HR focus on specific areas. He explained in detail the new Digital HR which serves as a good platform to deliver HR services.

He inspired students by sharing few lines from Ramayana and Bhagwat Geeta. He focused on words "Do and Demonstrate, Don't talk". The students participated and gave their 100%. They were truly inspired by his unique way of teaching and his enthusiasm which made the lecture even more interactive and fun.

Speaker - Mr Deepesh Sodhi-co-founder, Head Strategic Growth, Fludonomics Solutions

A guest lecture on E-commerce was conducted by Mr Deepesh Sodhi who is a co-founder, head strategic growth, Fludonomics Solutions. The session started with a brief explanation of E-commerce sector where he spoke about different segments in E-commerce. He shared with us few facts, current scenario of E-commerce sector. Also highlighted that India's largest online shopping is in fashion sector where market volume is USD 6.8 Billion in 2017 and 75% of India's e-shoppers were in age group 16 -35 years. This helped students understand the upcoming segments in E-commerce. He also introduced to the students to online logistics, web analytics how digital marketing done on different social media sites and how Google and Facebook has turned into a huge platform for advertising.

Towards the end, an interactive session was kept where students could ask questions related to topic. Mr Deepesh with his enthusiasm he kept the students engaged throughout the session.

- TYBBA - Event Management - 6th Feb 2018

Speaker - Ms. Vanita S N, owner and founder of Make Magic Events

Ms. Vanita began with giving the students a brief overview about what event management really is like, being a professional event manager for the past 16 years, she was able to give them some interesting insights into the topic. She told the girls about how she learnt on the job and assured them that a career in event management would require theory, but the bulk of the job is actually learnt while doing it. She touched upon the importance of events in today's world and how much of a scope it actually holds. The girls were assured of the fact that event management is a budding and growing career path, if they were to consider it for themselves. Ms. Vanita shared interesting real-life examples of some of the events she had organized in the past. She took up the example of birthday parties and a pirate themed party for BMW. Ms. Vanita also made sure to tell the girls about the various challenges that come with being an event manager. Building a good rapport with all the people you work with, keeping up with schedules and being resourceful are some of the qualities needed for a successful event manager. She assured the girls that though event management is an inherent skill, it is also a skill that can be learnt and acquired through practice. This proved to be an encouragement for the girls hoping to pursue this in their personal lives and as professionals. As the session drew to an end she emphasized to the girls, the importance of post event follow-up which can either make or break a successful event. The girls were deeply inspired by Ms. Vanita's enthusiasm, love for her work and the session ended with the girls feeling like they gained a real life perspective on Event Management.

## **NSS DEPARTMENT**

### **Inauguration Function**

The Inaugural function for 2017-18 was held on 26th July, 2017.

- Dr. Vishwambhar Choudhari and Adv. Asim Sarode inaugurated the yearly activities of the department.
- Dr. Chaudhari is a social activist, researcher and environmentalist. He has also participated in the peaceful civil agitations of Medha Patkar and Anna Hazare. After the recitation of the University song, Dr. Chaudhari guided the students on the topic- "Youth and Social Service". He put forth the idea People's Participation in a Democracy-Its Need and Importance". He discussed the qualities required for being a good contributing volunteer in the service of the nation. ### **Tree Plantation**

- The NSS Department, St. Mira's College for Girls initiated the Tree Plantation Drive on 3rd July, 2017. The tree plantation was conducted in association with the Botanical Survey of India, Koregaon Park Pune in their campus. 30 Trees were planted by the students which included- Bottle Palm, Mahogany, Phonex and Jamun Trees.
- The programme was organised by Prof. Veena Kenchi (NSS PO) and Dr. Meenal Sumant (NSS PO). Dr. Jadhav, Dr. Jayanti, Dr. Jalal of the Botanical Survey of India guided the student volunteers in planting the trees. Dr. Jadhav also guided the students on the importance of medicinal plants and the varieties available at their institute. 40 NSS volunteers of St. Mira's College for girls participated in the tree plantation activity. There will be regular monitoring and recording of the growth of the trees planted.

### Swachata Pakhwada (1st August to 15th August 2017)

- 1st to 15th August, 2017 was celebrated as Swachata Pakhwada by the NSS Dept of the college.
- The focus was on orientation and sensitisation of students regarding responsible behaviour in garbage disposal and general habits of cleanliness. For this, poster- making, talks and documentary screening was done. Last year, the NSS volunteers were given a task of identifying a swachata related problem in the college campus. Many of the students were of the opinion that the disposal of used sanitary pads needs some improvement. Therefore, the NSS department took a two way initiative of orienting students about responsible ways of disposing of sanitary pads and facilitating it by providing paper bags made out of old newspapers and magazines. NSS volunteers took up the responsibility of orienting and encouraging their classmates in this endeavour throughout the year. The NSS volunteers made the paper bags to be used for this project.

### The Following programmes were organised by the Department to create awareness, analyse and sensitise the students about the problem of cleanliness.

- 1st August, 2017 - orientation of NSS volunteers regarding Swachhata Pakhwada by NSS Programme Officers- Veena Kenchi and Meenal Sumant
- 3rd and 4th August, 2017- Creative expressions by NSS volunteers regarding Cleanliness- making of posters, slogans, poems, essays and articles.
- 3rd August, 2017- 'Classroom Cleaning' - The NSS volunteers cleaned college campus and classrooms.
- 5th to 12th August, 2017- Display of these expressions (posters, poems and slogans ) on college notice board.
- 5th August, 2017- In continuation with the NSS Department's effort , the volunteers this year too made paper bags for responsible disposal of used sanitary pads. These bags were made from old magazines and pamphlets.

Dr. Manisha Pimpalkhare guided the students for making these bags and their usage. On 8th August 2017- Talk by Prof. Veena Kenchi stressing the importance of individual responsibility of all citizens towards a Swachha and Swastha Bharat.

The volunteers cleaned the lawn and campus of the palace.

### One Day- University Level - Swachata Workshop

Pinky Mali and Ms. Mili from SYBCom participated in a One-Day Swachata Workshop. The workshop discussed the issue of e-Waste Management. The workshop included lecture, discussion and group activities on the theme of e-Waste.

## **CYCLOTHON**

The NSS volunteers actively participated in the Pune- Cyclothon event organised by the Savitribai Phule Pune University on 17th September 2017. 14 NSS Volunteers participated in this event. 5 of them participated as volunteers for the event - Pinky, Aishwarya, Navena, Madhura and Pratiksha. They helped organisers in managing the crowd, giving right instructions to the participants and guiding the participants till the end of the event. All the volunteers attended a pre-cyclothon meeting at SPPU. Nine girls from the college participated as participants. They cycled from their houses to S.P.College and participated in cycling. Seven girls, namely Reshma, Nishigandha, Vaishnavi, Sanam, Monika, Bhagyashree and Megha chose to cycle a track of 7 kilometers. Rajashree Kokate participated for 12 kilometers track and one of our students, Sae Gaikwad participated and cycled for 22 kilometers.

## **NSS DAY**

NSS Department of our college organised following activities on the occasion of NSS Day, on 23rd September 2017 and 25th September 2017.

1. **Demonstration on Hand Washing:** Mrs. Shanti Fernandis( Faculty, who has completed nursing course), gave a live demonstration on 'The Right Technique of Washing Hands cleanly'. Mrs. Shanti also gave useful tips for hand-washing, wiping out hands, use of sanitisers and paper soaps, etc.
  2. **Discussion with the Students:** Mrs. Shalini Iyer, Head; Dept. of Business Economics, interacted with the students and discussed with them 'The Importance of Clean Hands' and how to keep hands clean. She also showed a video highlighting the importance of washing hands cleanly. The NSS students discussed and convinced other students the importance of hand washing.
  3. **Showcasing the Posters:** We also asked students to express and showcase the dangers of not washing hands, benefits of washing hands through posters. Posters were displayed on the notice board to create awareness among the students.
- **Guest Speaker on the Use of Sanitizers:** Mr. Gopal Reddy, a Sales Manager, Garron Lab Pvt. Ltd. also interacted with our students and explained 'The Use of Sanitisers'. He explained the advantages of sanitisers over soap and hand-wash liquid and emphasised the use of sanitisers whenever water is not available. They distributed free samples of sanitisers to the students.

## **BLOOD DONATION CAMP**

- The NSS department of St. Mira's College in collaboration with Inlaks Budharani hospital, organised a 'Blood Donation Camp'. A team of the camp was much organised and well prepared. They reached college at 8.30 am and assembled the whole set within half an hour.
- Blood Donation began at 9.00 am. Students were first checked for weight, hemoglobin, blood pressure and various other required criteria. Eligible students were allowed to donate blood only after this thorough prior checking.
- After the donation of blood, donors were served with coffee, biscuits and banana. They were given the certificate of a donor. Total 113 students visited the camp, out of which only 24 could donate blood and 89 were rejected for not fulfilling the basic criteria. Two of the staff members of the college also donated blood. No casualty took place during the camp. 12 NSS volunteers worked hard to make this camp successful.

## **'ORIENTATION ON ORGAN DONATION' 31ST AUGUST, 2017**

The NSS department undertook orientation of the students regarding the importance of organ donation. Initially, a small video on 'Organ Donation' was shown to a students, followed by the discussion over it. Meenal



Sumant spoke to the students regarding the current data of loss of lives due to organ failure, importance of organ donation and benefits of organ donation.

Inaugural Session - At 12.00 noon the inauguration of the camp took place. The Chief Guest for the programme, Mr. Mangaldas Bandal (Ex- Speaker, ZP) interacted with the students. He stressed on the role of youth in Nation building. He shared stories of Alfred Nobel, Mahatma Gandhi and Dr Ambedkar to emphasise the importance of Service for the good of all. He stressed on the rural- urban divide in India and how the NSS camp experience can be used to contribute in bridging this divide. He further urged the volunteers to take this opportunity of learning from a new environment and also to find more innovative ways of developing villages through education, trade, commerce, as well as social service.

The Sarpanch, Mr. Vikas Shivale gave a brief history of the village of Parodi. He explained the concept of a group gram panchayat and discussed the agenda of the camp with the students.

The Upsarpanch-Mrs. Satkar, Mr. Ganesh Temgire and other Gram Panchayat members from the village were

present for the function. St. Mira's College for Girls, Vice-Principal - Mrs. Madhuchanda Banerjee, Professors-Dr. Vaishali Diwakar, Dr. Jaya Rajgopalan, Dr. Vaishali Joshi were also present during the function.

Post lunch, the NSS volunteers were divided into various teams. They were assigned tasks to be undertaken and were given details about the schedule of the Camp. Team building activities were conducted for the volunteers.

In the evening, the volunteers were engaged in an interactive session followed by an impromptu group discussion on 'My Idea of Social Service'.

### **Day 2 - Saturday 2nd December, 2017 :**

Our mornings in the camp started with prayer time- Sanctuary followed by exercises. This was followed by a rally conveying the message of 'Beti Bachao'. This day, the volunteers took over the teaching of the ZP Primary School, Parodi. The classes were conducted by the volunteers. Various art and craft activities, storytelling and games were organized for the students. An inter-class coloring competition was organised for the primary school students. In the morning session, a book donation programme was arranged for the ZP Primary School, Parodi. The St. Mira's College staff and NSS Volunteers contributed books for donation. A short programme was arranged in the presence of Mr. Sambhaji Temgire (Chairman- Shala Samiti). A total of 150 books were donated to the school. The NSS volunteers have showed an eagerness to set up a library for the school students. In the afternoon session - Ms. Veena Kenchi interacted with the students on the topic- "Role of NSS in Nation building". In the post-lunch session- the volunteers undertook Weeding and Cleaning of the area around the burial ground at Parodi for three hours. In the evening, a lecture on 'Meditation and Reiki' for NSS Volunteers and villagers by Ms. Manjita Kulkarni. She introduced the healing method Reiki and its use for dealing with everyday stress and fatigue. In the post-dinner session, Group Discussions were conducted on the topics- Environment Protection and Use of Social Media

### **Day 3 - Sunday, 3rd December, 2017:**

Sanctuary was followed by Yoga. This was followed by a rally spreading the message of Water Literacy and judicious use of water. After a long walk to the Peer Saheb Dargah- the volunteers undertook a two hour cleanliness drive at the Dargah. In the pre- lunch session, a Lecture on 'Personality Development' by Ms. Komal Tujare was arranged. She gave them tips to enhance the various traits of their personality and how to present themselves socially. In the post lunch session, Team Building Games were conducted by Ms. Komal Tujare and Ms. Roma Dar for the volunteers. Sign language and team efforts were enhanced by these activities. In the evening, the volunteers performed two Street Plays for the villagers of Parodi. The villagers appreciated the students' efforts. The first street-play was on 'Swachhata' which stressed the importance of individual and collective efforts in realising our goal of Swachha Bharat. The second street play, 'Beti Bachao' emphasised the importance of the girl child in our families. The various forms of discrimination against girls were depicted with role reversal in the families. This day being a Dutt Jayanti; the volunteers also participated in the cultural activities of the village. The volunteers participated in the 2-hour Bhajan programme of the Bhajani Mandal.

### **Day 4 - Monday, 4th December, 2017:**

A rally was conducted, conveying the message of Swaccha Bharat. To translate the words into action, the NSS volunteers also took up cleaning of the roads in the village. The volunteers had a conversation with Ex-MLA Ashok Pawar and Ex-Speaker of ZP - Pradip Kand. Mr. Pawar encouraged the students to think differently and try to make inventions which will help in social and community welfare. In the pre-lunch sessions, the students interacted with Shirur Taluka BDO - Mr. Sandeep Jathar. He explained the role of youth in human development. This interaction was followed by distribution of uniforms to anganwadi students of Parodi School. The post-lunch session had volunteers interacting with Ms. Shalini Iyer, Ms. Deepanjali Mujumdar and Ms. Hasina Shaikh of St. Mira's College.

A three hour Tree Plantation drive was undertaken at Mhalungi. The NSS volunteers planted 80 trees in the vicinity of the burial ground at Shivtakrar Mhalungi. The evening was well spent by the volunteers by interacting with the village women. The volunteers realised a lack of young girls in the village.



**Day 5 - Tuesday, 5th December, 2017:**

The day started with a rally conveying the message of Swaccha Bharat. The NSS volunteers also took up cleaning of the roads in the village. Activities for school children were held at Satakarwadi ZP school. The volunteers visited the ZP school at Satkarwadi. They organised various programmes for the school students and conducted an inter-class colouring competition for the primary school students. One team of volunteers cooked food for the primary school students of Parodi. The mid-day meal was provided by the volunteers to the students. The volunteers also undertook a primary survey of Satkarwadi to understand the population composition and occupation in the village. They also tried to gauge the use of internet and mobile amongst the villagers. In the post-lunch session, a lecture was conducted by Prof. Jyoti Chintan on the topic- Development of Leadership Skills.

In the later session- one team of volunteers conducted the village survey at Parodi.

The evening was well spent by the volunteers by listening to Marathi Kavita Vachan, 'Mata, Mati and Sanskriti' by Mr. Bharat Daundkar. Mr. Daundkar is one of the 10 most popular Marathi poets in Maharashtra. He recited various poems related to Mother, our origins and our culture. The session was truly enjoyed by the volunteers and the villagers.

The post-tea session was arranged for better interaction with the village women. Mehendi Programme by NSS Volunteers for Village Women was organised to make the women talk about themselves so the volunteers learn about the experiences of the women of the village.

**Day 6 - Wednesday, 6th December, 2017:**

In the morning, a small Prize Distribution ceremony was conducted at Satkarwadi ZP School for the colouring competition. 50 books were donated by the volunteers to this school. The mid-morning session had a lecture on The importance of Exercise by Ms. Ekata Jadhav for the volunteers and the primary school children at Parodi. Self Defence Demonstrations were conducted by Mr. Bhandari and his team of students. Prof. N. N. Shejwal - Area Coordinator, visited NSS Camp site and interacted with the volunteers. The interaction was followed by Prize Distribution of the Colouring Competition at Parodi by Prof. N. N. Shejwal, Mr. Bhandari and Ms. Ekata Jadhav.

The Valedictory Function was organised in the evening. The Speaker of Panchayat Samiti. Mr. Subhashji Umap was the Chief Guest for the programme. Mr. Ganpatrao Kalkute, addressed the students discussing the importance of women in bringing a change in the society. A Cultural Programme consisting of Dance and Song was arranged by NSS Volunteers for the Villagers.

**Day 7 - Thursday, 7th December, 2017:**

The volunteers contributed Shramdaan: Cleaning school premises and rooms and handing over the rooms to the school. A visit to Vyankatesh Sugar factory was organised for the volunteers.

The NSS volunteers returned to Pune enriched by the novel experience of rural surroundings, generous hospitality of the villagers, memories of hard labour undertaken and the dignity in it, and the discipline that comes naturally with camp life.



## STUDENT DEVELOPMENT CELL

**Hasina Shaikh and Manjita Kulkarni**

St. Mira's College has successfully implemented three very important schemes under the Students Development Cell during the Academic Year 2017-18:

1. Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Earn While Learn Scheme
2. Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan
3. Personality Development Workshop

The broad aim of these programmes is to empower girl students by providing them equal opportunities of development. Under this programme, we have also undertaken activities such as celebration of International Yoga Day, Sadhbhavna Divas, Tree Plantation, Gender Champion and students also participated in initiatives such as Swachha Bharat Abhiyan and Drive for Voting.

### **Karmaveer Bhaurao Patil Earn While Learn Scheme**

St. Mira's college is an institution which focuses on value education. Our students learn to respect labor and believe in dignity of labor. "Earn while Learn" scheme of the Savitribai Phule Pune University had been a perfect opportunity for our students to demonstrate their values.

The objective of this scheme stated by the University is to cultivate responsibility and social awareness while they pursue education. The criteria for selection for this scheme is based on the marks they have obtained in the previous exam, regular attendance in college, sincerity towards work and study, positive attitude and their sensitivity towards social problems and inadequate financial help from their parents. Based on these criteria, 12 students were selected from the Arts and Commerce faculty. They are engaged in Office work, BBA office, MBA office, Library, NSS and Psychology lab. These students work in the Library and are engaged in tasks such as shelving, recording for the blind students, and handling the book borrowing counter.

### **Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan**

Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan was organised in St. Mira's College from 17th to 19th January, 2018 with an objective of inculcating fearlessness among girl students. Fearlessness is seen as an important personality trait which refers to both a physical and mental ability to control and cope up with one's social environment. In case of girls, who face gender bias in all walks of life, it is a great challenge to inculcate the value of fearlessness. In recent years, on one hand we see women working in all fields equally with men, but the incidents of abuse and violence against women are also consistently rising. In order to become a fearless woman, a girl not only requires education, social or family support but also must be financially independent. So, a campaign like Nirbhay Kanya Abhiyan is very essential in helping students understand structural constraints that restrict their freedom and learn ways and strategies to deal with them. On 17th January, 2018, the Abhiyan was inaugurated at the hands of Dr. Gulshan Gidwani, Principal of St. Mira's College. In the inaugural session Prof. Manjita Kulkarni welcomed the participants and presented the details of three day's programme. Prof. Hasina Shaikh explained the importance of the campaign and appealed to students to participate wholeheartedly and make efforts to change oneself in the direction of fearlessness.

The first session was on Self- Defence, conducted by Mr. Balkrishna Bhandari, Sports Coach and Taekwondo Expert. Mr. Bhandari first explained how self-defense is very closely related to self-confidence. He said that in today's world when incidents of abuse and violence against women are consistently increasing, the first and obvious

reaction of the family is to increase restrictions on girls. This affects their self-confidence. Instead, if the girls are taught to protect themselves, they can move around without any fear. Mr. Bhandari then showed simple means of self-defence which the girls can use to protect themselves in regular situations like bus travel. Then he demonstrated self-defence tactics to be used in situations of physical violence or eve-teasing involving physical abuse. He showed how simple techniques using one's reflexes can be employed to defend oneself. Mr. Bhandari then demonstrated with the help of volunteers some very useful self-defence actions which the girls have to learn only through regular practice. He then conducted an elaborate practice session for students of all self-defence tactics he had shown. At the end he said that self-defence exercises must be practiced on a regular basis and not remain only at a workshop level, where most participants forget it very quickly. Girls promised that they will imbibe it properly as they have understood the importance of self-defence.

The second session was on Nutrition and Diet conducted by Mrs. Varsha Nandedkar, a specialist in Nutrition. She explained the importance of diet and nutrition for adolescence. She explained the meaning of diet, its vital nutrients for survival and helps the body function and keeps healthy. She explained the importance of protein, carbohydrates and fats. She gave number of examples for healthy diet in day to day life. She suggested students to have milk, fruits, vegetables, etc. It was an interactive session where students asked their queries regarding health, weight loss and weight gain. She even focused on physical fitness with the help of exercises and diet. She guided the students for diet plans and asked them to follow those for maintaining health. She insisted that small meals at small intervals are good for health. She even told the students to get their tiffins and not have junk food, as it is not good for health. Overall, the session was very inspiring for the students.

The first day's programme was concluded with a vote of thanks by Prof. Manjita Kulkarni.

### **2nd Day, 18th January, 2018**

On the second day of the workshop, the programme began with the first session - a presentation by Prof. Abradhita and Prof. Shanti, members of Centre for Women Entrepreneur Cell (CWE) at St. Mira's College for Girls, Pune. They informed the students about the establishment of CWE, its purpose and what activities the cell undertakes. They encouraged the students to attend the programmes organised by them, like guest lectures, field visits, etc. They even asked when the ex-students or they themselves are interested in starting their self-employment. Assistance could be given by guiding them in all aspects.

The second session on Financial Employment was conducted by Mrs. Soniya Sumant, an Entrepreneur as well a Manager at Just Dial. She demonstrated how perfume, deodorant and fragrant essential oil (attar) are made in a very easy way. She explained the ingredients required for perfume. Then, step by step, the procedure was narrated as well as practically shown. She asked some students to come forward and do it practically so that they can get hands on experience. She explained financial and marketing strategies. She guided the students regarding the availability of the material required for making perfumes. She also threw light on her journey of becoming a successful entrepreneur. All the students were inspired by this session.

The third session was on self-employment for women, that was conducted by Mrs. Gargi Sharma, a successful entrepreneur. The session threw light on her beautiful world of creativity, which includes home décor, handmade jewellery, craft, gifting ideas, chocolates with an endless list of excellent ideas. She shared some glimpses from her journey of becoming a successful entrepreneur. She proudly narrated that she is employing many women under her supervision. The students were inspired by her unique creative ideas and were inspired to become independent and successful self-employed women who can fearlessly overcome the hurdles that comes in the way of travelling at the peak of success. The second day was successfully concluded by conveying a vote of appreciation by Prof. Manjita Kulkarni to all the resource persons.

### **3rd Day, 19th January, 2018**

On third day, the first session was on Women security conducted by the team of Lokayat, a NGO working in the field of gender equality and community development. The first speaker was Mrs. Alka Joshi, a member at Lokayat. The session involved making girls aware of the structural constraints in the form of patriarchy and discussing strategies to fight against gender bias. At the beginning of the session, she narrated two stories regarding women



security, which led to an intense discussion.

It helped students to open up and share their experiences. Mrs. Alka Joshi explained how violence against women is deeply rooted in the patriarchal structure. She said that women are still treated as part of the family or community and not as independent individuals. She further stressed the need to build support groups of youth to bring in change at social level.

The second session was on Law and Women conducted by Miss Anita Mahadik, a member of Lokayat. She created awareness about law related to women. She also explained the importance of law education for women's security. She also expressed the need to look at women as free individuals and create an environment in which they can live independently. She shared her experiences at her workplace which inspired the students. The queries of the students were satisfied with appropriate examples. She addressed the work of Lokayat in bringing Gender Equality and appealed students to attend their programmes which are aimed at inculcating values of equality, democracy and social justice.

The three days programme were concluded by the expressive note by some of the students. The vote of thanks was given by Prof. Manjita Kulakarni.

### **Personality Development Workshop**

A one day Personality Development Workshop was organized under the Student Development Cell in St. Mira's college on 31st January 2018. The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. Vaishali Joshi, Dept. of Sociology and ex-Student Welfare Officer of St. Mira's College and Mr. Sujeet Shinde, Co-founder and Partner, Training India, Pune. At the beginning of the programme, Prof. Haseena Shaikh, SDO, welcomed the participants and introduced the programme. Prof Manjita Kulkarni, explained the objective of this programme. She mentioned that the Savitribai Phule Pune University launched this programme to provide a platform for girl students to go beyond classroom learning and attain overall personality development. She further mentioned that in a college like St. Mira's founded on teachings of Sadhu Vaswani and Dada J. P. Vaswani, women's empowerment stands at the centre of formal education. A programme like Personality Development is implemented keeping in mind our core mission of the triple training of the Head, the Heart and the Hands.

In her speech Dr. Vaishali Joshi explained that more than the physical personality, it is the inner strength that makes the true personality of an individual. She said that the students should have a hobby or an art. So, the students must strive to seek knowledge, develop critical thinking and must always keep themselves active. She further mentioned that the students must learn to develop an art if they don't have, so they will indulge in it and develop their personality. She congratulated the Student Development Board for having designed such initiative which focuses on the overall personality of students.

In the first session, Mrs. Purva Rane, a resource person from Training India, Pune, interacted with the students on the topic Communication Skills. She said that personality is not limited to physical aspects, rather it is largely related to how we manage our skills and emotions. She said that the expressions, gestures, movements, tone of voice are related to communication skills. While communicating in formal and informal way, suppressing emotions is not right and the best way to have control on our own lives is through dealing with the emotions in a right sense.

She guided the students with effective techniques to communicate in a formal situation as well as informal, the students used those techniques and performed in a role-play. She told the students that it is important to instruct the mind to develop in an affirmative direction. Letting fear and tension control ourselves leads to stress and it is very important to share tension rather than suppressing it. She motivated the students to share and communicate effectively. This session set a very positive and motivating tone for the workshop.

The second session was on Motivation and self-belief conducted by Mr. Sujeet Shinde, a co-founder and partner of Training India, Pune. This was an interactive session focusing on concrete themes like self motivation, building confidence, goal-setting and how to achieve them. He conveyed the message with the help of effective storytelling. He told the students to be focused on goal attainment with positive thinking and attitude. He explained in a very convincing manner how important it is for a youth to set goals and be aware of the difficulties in achieving these goals. He also guided them about how to avoid chaos and confusion in goal setting and goal achievement. He used various interactive techniques and involved students actively in the session. .

The third session was on power of positive thinking conducted by Mrs. Sonika Shah, a resource person from Training India. She conducted an activity based session on Image of an adolescence. She first explained the meaning and importance of image. She said 'image' has to be consciously developed. She gave some tips for grooming and patterns of behavior at the professional levels. She made the students feel very comfortable to open up and express themselves freely. Through the video clips and innovative activities she convinced students that appearance, style, etiquettes are important aspects of our personality. She also made students aware about the role of positive thinking in personality development. At the end of the workshop, Prof. Manjita Kulkarni delivered Vote of Thanks.

Students participated in the programme with full heart and enthusiasm. The speakers and participants gave a very positive feedback of the workshop.

The library is spread across two levels with a total area of 10499 sq ft with a seating capacity of approximately 500. 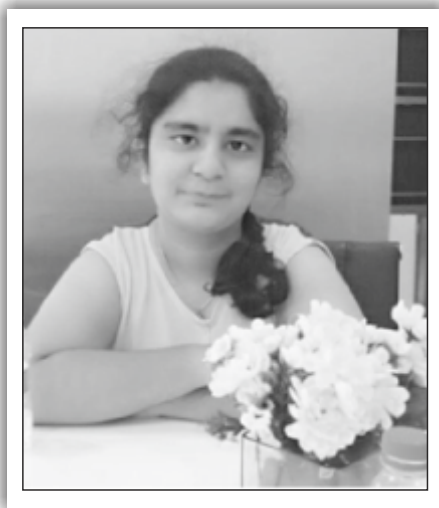
## Humans of St Mira's

# DO YOU HAVE THESE BIZARRE PHOBIAS?

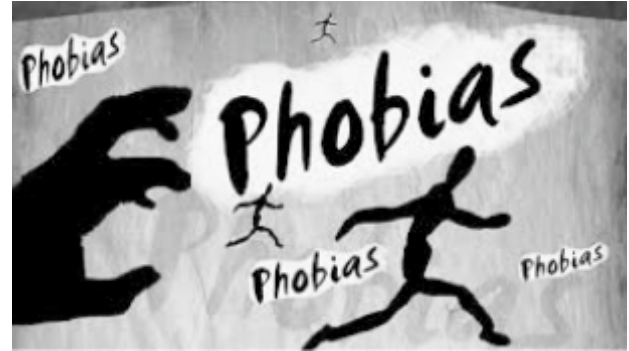

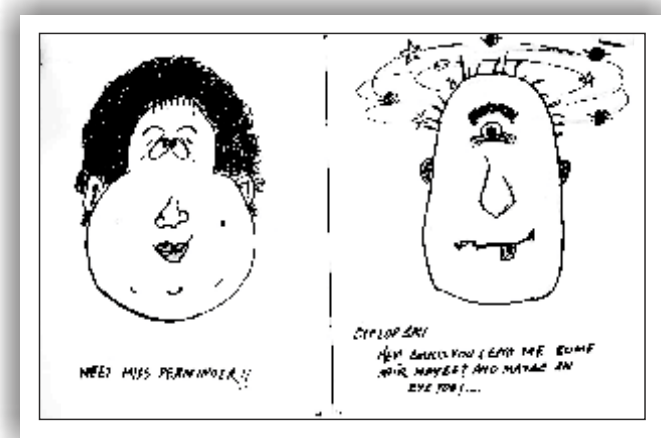
**PAPYROPHOBIA** - Fear of Paper

 Is this real, what do you say?

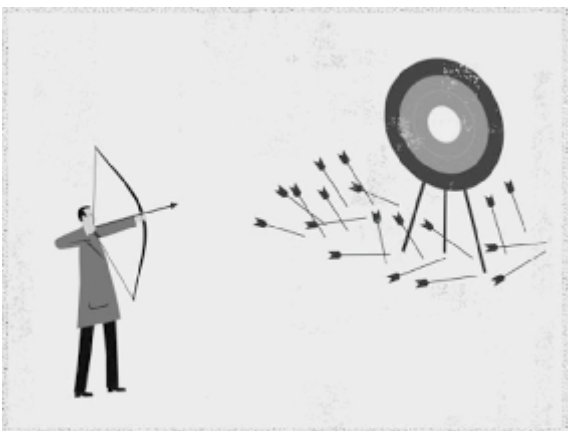

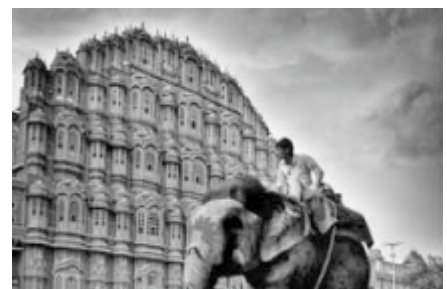

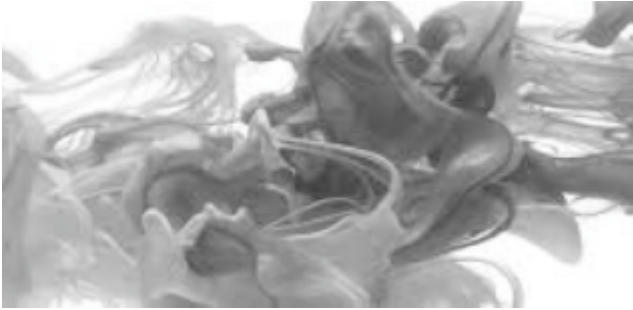

They all think it was the U.S. But they all think wrong. We all are just little pawns of the game. A sly, wicked game played by an equally monstrous man. If you can call him that.

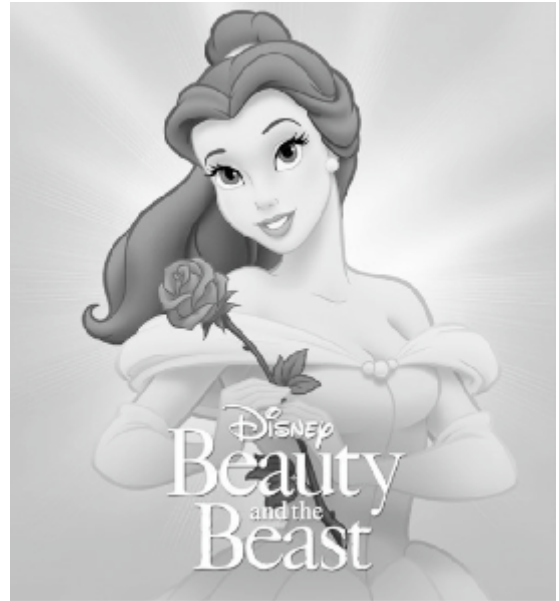

## सार्वजनिक गणेशोत्सव - काल व आज.....

१८९३ साली लोकमान्य टिळकांनी “केसरी” या वर्तमानपत्रातून सार्वजनिक गणेशोत्सवाची संकल्पना लोकांसमोर मांडली.

स्वातंत्र्यपूर्व काळात ब्रिटीश सरकारने सार्वजनिक सभा आणि लोकांना एकत्र येण्यास बंदी घातली होती आणि जन जागृतीसाठी लोकांना एकत्र आणणे अत्यंत गरजेचे होते. देशाला स्वातंत्र्य मिळवून देण्याच्या विचाराने लोकमान्य टिळक भारले होते. लोकांना एकत्र कसे आणता येईल याचा विचार करत गिरगांव चौपाटीवर समुद्र किनारी बसल्या बसल्या ते वाळूपासून मूर्त्या बनवत व त्या मूर्त्या पहायला लोक जमा होत. त्या मूर्त्यांना पाहिल्यावर लोकांच्या येणाऱ्या प्रतिक्रियांवरून टिळकांना असे समजले की भारतीय लोक हे अत्यंत श्रद्धाळू व ईश्वराला घाबरणारे आहेत. देव आणि धार्मिक भावनांचा भारतीय जनमानसांच्या मनावर एवढा जबरदस्त पगडा आहे की धार्मिक कार्यासाठी आपापसातील हेवे दावे व वैर विसरून ते एकत्र येतात. यामुळे टिळकांच्या मनात विखुरलेल्या जनतेला एकत्र बांधण्यासाठी एक आशेचा किरण निर्माण झाला.

बुध्दीची देवता गणपती ही सर्व स्तरातील लोकांना प्रिय आणि पुजनीय असल्यामुळे या कार्यासाठी त्यांनी गणेशोत्सवाची निवड केली. हिंदू दिनदर्शिकेनुसार भाद्रपद महिन्यातील शुक्ल पक्षातील चतुर्थीला दहा दिवसांच्या गणेशोत्सवाची सुरुवात झाली आणि अनंत चतुर्थीला गणेश मूर्तीचे विसर्जन करायची प्रथा पडली. उत्सवाच्या निमित्ताने लोक एकत्र जमत असत. त्यामुळे त्यांचे प्रबोधन करणे सहज शक्य होते. ब्रिटीश सरकार धार्मिक कारणास्तव या उत्सवाला विरोध करू शकत नसल्यामुळे, टिळकांचा लोकांमध्ये राष्ट्राभिमान, एकता स्वातंत्र्य मिळवण्याची प्रेरणा निर्माण करण्याचा हेतू सफल झाला. टिळकांनी गणेश विसर्जनाची मिरवणूक काढण्याची संकल्पना मांडली.

शिवाजी महाराजांच्या काळातही हा सण स्थानिक संस्कृतीचा प्रसार करण्यासाठी सार्वजनिकरित्या साजरा केला जायचा. नंतर पेशव्यांच्या काळात पुणे हे गणेशोत्सवाचे केंद्रस्थान बनले. पेशव्यांनी प्रोत्साहन देऊन या सणाची महती वाढवली पण पुढे पेशवाईचे पतन झाल्यावर मात्र या सणाचे महत्व कमी झाले. लोक फक्त आपापल्या घरातच हा सण साजरा करू लागल्यामुळे हळूहळू या सणाचे रूप गायब झाले. पुढे भाऊसाहेब लक्ष्मण जावळे यांनी १८९२ साली भाऊसाहेब रंगारी गणपती – बुधवार पेठ या नावाने सर्वप्रथम गणपतीच्या मूर्तीची स्थापना करून पुण्यात सार्वजनिक गणेशोत्सव सुरू करण्याविषयीची पहिली बैठक भाऊसाहेब लक्ष्मण जावळे यांच्या अध्यक्षतेखाली बुधवार पेठ, पुणे येथील त्यांच्या निवासस्थानी घेतली गेली ज्याला “भाऊ रंगारी भवन” म्हणून ओळखले जाते.

पुढे १८९३ साली लोकमान्य टिळकांनी “केसरी” या वर्तमानपत्रातून सार्वजनिक गणेशोत्सवाची संकल्पना लोकांसमोर मांडली. १८९४ साली पुण्यातील “केसरीवाडा” येथे टिळकांनी गणपतीच्या मातीच्या मूर्तीची स्थापना केली. त्याला सार्वजनिक उत्सवाचे स्वरूप प्राप्त झाले. आज हा उत्सव सर्व भारतात उत्साहाने साजरा केला जातो. पण महाराष्ट्र, कर्नाटक, तेलंगणामध्ये या उत्सवाला विशेष महत्व आहे. भारताबाहेर, नेपाळमधील तराई भाग व इतर देश जसे अमेरिका, कॅनडा, सिंगापूर येथील हिंदू लोक हा उत्सव उत्साहात साजरा करतात.

लोकांच्या एकत्रीकरणाच्या उद्देशाने पुढे “एक गाव एक गणपती” ही संकल्पना पण रुजली. आज मात्र सगळे चित्र पालटले आहे. टिळकांनी मांडलेली मूळ संकल्पना बाजूला पाडून केवळ एक प्रथा बनून राहिली आहे. उत्सव साजरा करण्याच्या पध्दतीतही आमूलाग्र बदल झाला आहे. एक गाव एक गणपती जाऊन आता एक रस्ता दहा गणपती हा प्रकार सुरु झाला आहे. चौका-चौकात गणेश मंडळे स्थापन झाली आहेत. सर्व मंडळे मोठ मोठे देखावे मांडून कर्कश्य आवाजात DJ वाजवून, सेलिब्रिटींना बोलावून लोकांना आकर्षक वाटण्यासाठी या सर्व गोष्टींचा आटापीटा करताना दिसतात. मंडळाच्या सभासदांनी वर्गणीच्या, नावाखाली सामन्य जनतेची लूट करणे हे तर नित्याचेच झाले आहे. आजकाल शाडूच्या मातीच्या मूर्त्या जाऊन प्लास्टर ऑफ पॅरिसच्या मूर्त्यांना प्राधान्य दिले जाते.

कर्णकटू आवाजातील बिभत्स गाणी आणि DJ हा आजकाल सर्वांच्याच जिव्हाळयाचा विषय झाला आहे. त्या आवाजामुळे तान्ही मुले व ज्येष्ठ नागरिकांना होणारा त्रास तर कोणाच्या खिजगणतीतही नसतो. स्पिकरच्या भिंतीसमोर कानठळया बसवणाऱ्या गाण्यांच्या तालावर अंगविक्षेप करत नाचणारी मुले पाहिली की त्यांचे कौतुक करणाऱ्या त्यांच्या आई-बापाची कीव कराविशी वाटते. एवढया मोठया डेसिबल्सच्या आवाजाचे आपल्या लहानग्यांच्या ऐकण्याच्या क्षमतेवर किती दूरगामी परिणाम होतील हेही त्यांच्या लक्षात येऊ नये, याचेच आश्चर्य वाटते. ऐन गणेशोत्सवात मंडपामागे दारुच्या बाटल्यांचे ढीग सापडल्याच्या येणाऱ्या बातम्या तसेच कार्यक्रम आटपल्यावर श्रमपरिहाराच्या नावानर गुपचुप चालणाऱ्या नॉनव्हेज ओल्या पाट्यांच्या बातम्या मन विषण्ण करतात.

कोणाचा गणपती सर्वात मोठा ? मिरवणूकीत कोणता गणपती सर्वात पुढे उभा राहणार ? कोणत्या मंडळाचा देखावा सर्वात भव्य आहे ? DJ चा सर्वात मोठा थर कोणत्या मंडळाचा आहे ? सर्वात मोठे ढोल पथक कोणाचे ? कोणते मंडळ, किती मोठा सेलिब्रिटी आणते हयाचीच चुरस सर्व मंडळांमध्ये दिसते. सगळीकडे साधेपणापेक्षा नुसता बडेजावच जास्त आढळतो. स्थानिक नेते आणि व्यापारी, सणाचेही औचित्य साधून आपली जाहिरात करतात व त्या बदल्यात मंडळाचा बक्कळ पैसा मिळतो. जो अवास्तव खर्च भागवण्यासाठी वापरला जातो. अनधिकृतपणे जे मांडव घालून अध्यापिका जास्त किंवा पूर्ण रस्ताच अडवला जातो. वाहतुकीस अडथळा होतो म्हणून तक्रार करणाऱ्या वाहनचालकास दमदाटी प्रसंगी मारहाण करायलाही काही मंडळाचे सदस्य मागे पुढे पाहत नाहीत. काही वेळेस वेळेवर आगीची माहिती मिळूनही अग्निशामक दलाच्या गाडया योग्यवेळी घटनास्थळी पोहोचून शकल्यामुळे निष्कारण जीवितहानी व वित्तहानी तर होतेच पण त्या आगीत पिडीतांच्या घराबरोबर त्यांच्या सुंदर भविष्याच्या स्वप्नांचीही राखरांगोळी होऊन जाते. पण या सगळ्यांपेक्षाही महत्वाचा आहे तो उत्सव नाही का ? कोणाच्या सुख दुःखाशी आपल्याला काय देणे घेणे ? गर्दीचा फायदा घेऊन घडणारे गुन्हे, लहान मुलांचे हरवणे, दारुडयांची भांडणे इ. हे सर्व नित्याचेच झाले आहे.

थोडयाफार फरकाने सर्व उत्सवांची आज हीच अवस्था आहे. मूर्त्या व फोटो बदलतात पण उत्सव साजरा करायची पध्दत मात्र तीच. सर्वच मंडळे असे करतात. काही मंडळे खुपच स्तुत्य कामगिरी बजावतात पण दुर्दैवाने ती हाताच्या बोटावर मोजण्याइतकी कमी आहेत. आपली वाटचाल नक्की कुठल्या दिशेने सुरु आहे ? आज जे आपण काही करतोय ते अंतर्मुख होऊन पुनःविचार करण्याची वेळ आली आहे, असे कोणालाच वाटत नाही का ?

खरं बघायला गेलो तर वेळ अजून गेली नाही. आपण सर्वांनी जर ठरवले तर ही परिस्थिती बदलू शकतो. उत्सवांवर वारेमाप खर्च केला जाणारा पैसा राष्ट्र उभारणीसाठी व समाजातील प्रत्येक दुर्बल घटकाला सबल करण्यासाठी खर्च केल्यास टिळकांच्या गणेशोत्सव सुरु करण्यामागचा उद्देश सफल करण्याच्या दृष्टीने हे आपले पहिले पाऊल असेल. मंगलमूर्तीच्या आगमनाने आपणा सर्वांच्या मनावर साचलेली दांभिकतेची पुटे दूर होवोत व सर्वांनाच सद्बुध्दी व सन्मती प्राप्त होवो ही सदिच्छा.





## आई

लेखकांनी व कविंनीदेखील कथा, लेख, कविता मधून अशा मातृत्वाचे गुणवर्णन केले आहे. त्यांच्या अभंगातून लिखाणातून संत महंतांनीदेखील अशा मातृशक्तीचा त्यांना झालेला विलक्षण अनुभव वर्णन केला आहे. महर्षी व्यासांनी वेदाचे सार सांगताना अनेक ठिकाणी आईच्या महनमंगलतेचा दृष्टांत दिलेला आहे. ज्ञानेश्वर माऊलींनी मातृत्वाची अनेक प्रतीके आपल्या साहित्यातून वर्णिली आहेत. संत तुकाराम महाराज म्हणातात “ऐसी कळवळ्याची जाती, लाभावीण करी प्रीती” संत एकनाथ महाराज, रामदास स्वामी इ. संतांनी मातृत्वाचे यथार्थ गुणगान आपल्या रचनेत केले आहे. अपार प्रेमाने आई-वडिलांची सेवा करणाऱ्या भक्त पुंडलिकाला तर विठ्ठलाने वरदान दिले आहे की, प्रत्यक्ष देवाच्या आधी संत पुंडलिकाचे नाव घेतले जाईल म्हणूनच आपण म्हणतो “पुंडलिक वरदा हारी विठ्ठल”

संत वाङ्मयाचे गाढे अभ्यासक डॉ. रामचंद्र देखणे म्हणतात की, परमेश्वराचे मूर्त स्वरूप म्हणजे “आई” कधीही अस्ताला न जाणारा सूर्य व पौर्णिमेचा चंद्र ह्या दोन्ही प्रतिमा ह्या ठिकाणी एकत्र येतात त्याला “आई” असे म्हणतात. आईचे चरण स्पर्श करतो तेव्हा तीर्थक्षेत्राचे दर्शन होते.

“मी पायधूळ घेतो जेव्हा तुझी जराशी

माझी ललाट रेषा बनते प्रयाग काशी”

तर अशी ही आई सगळ्या विश्वाचा आदर्श असणारी, विश्वाला आधार देणारी, कृपा व शक्ती म्हणजे विश्वाला मिळालेले एक ईश्वरी वरदान आहे. अशा मातृशक्तीचे चिंतन मनन करणे तिला वंदन करणे मी माझे भाग्य समजते.

आपल्या निर्मितीसोबत राहता येत नाही. म्हणून परमेश्वराने “आई” निर्माण केली. त्यामुळे परमेश्वराला आईचा खूप अभिमान आहे.

ज्या समाजात आपण राहतो त्या समाजाचे ऋण फेडणे हे प्रत्येकाचे कर्तव्य आहे. ही कर्तव्याची जाणीव आपल्या

बाळामध्ये ओतप्रोत भरून त्याला कर्तबगार बनवून समाजापुढे एक गौरवशाली मातृत्वाचा आदर्श निर्माण करणाऱ्या हया आईचा उल्लेख तिच्यापुढे मानाचा मुजरा घालूनच करायला हवा. छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांच्या मातोश्री जिजाऊ आईसाहेब यांनी आपल्या कर्तबगारीने हा सन्मान मिळवला.

“श्यामची आई”या चित्रपटाच्या शेवटी श्यामची आई मृत्यू पावते. तेव्हा प्रतिकात्मक रितीने कवी यशवंत यांची आई ही कविता सादर केली आहे. अतिशय हृदयस्पर्शी अशी ही कविता आहे.

“आई म्हणोनी कोणी आईस हाक मारी  
ती हाक येई कानी मज होय शोक भारी  
स्वामी तिन्ही जगाचा आई विना भिकारी”

साने गुरुजींनी श्यामची आई यामध्ये वर्णन केलेल्या आईच्या व्यक्तीमत्त्वास कवी यशवंताच्या आई या कवितेने एका परमोच्च उंचीवर नेले आहे. अशीच एक सध्याच्या काळातील आई आहे. जिला स्वतःचाही भार उचलणे कठीण होते. खरे तर आई या शब्दातच विलक्षण सामर्थ्य आहे.

नवऱ्याने घरातून हाकललेली, हातात स्वतःचे तान्हे बाळ काय करावे, कुठे जावे, कसे जगावे हया विवंचनेत असलेली ही आई म्हणजेच “सिंधुताई सपकाळ” बघता बघता एक हजार मुलांची आई म्हणून ओळखली जाऊ लागली स्वतःच्या वेदना दुःख बाजूला ठेऊन तिने अनाथ मुलांना आपलेसे केले. त्यांची आई झाली आणि हजार मुलांची आई होण्याचे शिवधनुष्य तिने लिलया पेलले धैर्य वात्सल्य, सहनशिलता हया सद्गुणांची पराकाष्ठा इथे दिसते. तशाच साधनाताई आमटे पतीने स्वतःला कुष्ठरोग्यांच्या सेवेला वाहून घेतले ही माऊली पतीच्या पावलांवर पाऊल ठेऊन निघाली. मागे स्वतःचीच एक पाऊलवाट बनवली. त्यावरून त्यांची दोन्ही मुले डॉ. प्रकाश आमटे आणि डॉ. विकास आमटे चालू लागले. सर्वसाधारणपणे आमच्यासारखी आई आपल्या मुलांना जपते पण साधनाताईंनी जपली आपल्या मुलांच्या मनातली माणुसकी, दोन्ही मुलांना डॉक्टर केले पण, पैसा कमावणे हा हेतू न ठेवता गरिबांच्या, कुष्ठरोग्यांच्या डोळ्यातील अश्रू पुसणे हा हेतू ठेवला. शिक्षणाचे बळ त्यांनी या उदात्त हेतूसाठी वापरले.

साधनाताईंच्या हृदयातल्या निर्मळ मातृत्वाने आपल्या मुलांना वेगळा पण योग्य मार्ग दाखवला. कवी बोरकरांना साधनाताईंच्या हया वेगवेगळेपणाचा अभिमान वाटला. कवी बोरकर एकदा आनंदवनाला भेट देण्यासाठी गेले होते. आनंदवन पाहताना बाबांच्या सत्कार्याचा तो उत्तुंग हिमालय पाहून ते भारावून गेले व अशा हिमालयाला गवसणी घालणाऱ्या आईच्या हातांचे त्यांना कौतुक वाटले. मनोमन त्यांनी साधनाताईंना लेक मानले. व पित्याच्या मायेने उत्स्फूर्तपणे ते म्हणाले,

“कसे उत्तुंग वादळ, तुझ्या मिठीत गावले, पिता असुनी मुली मी, तुझी वंदितो पाऊले”

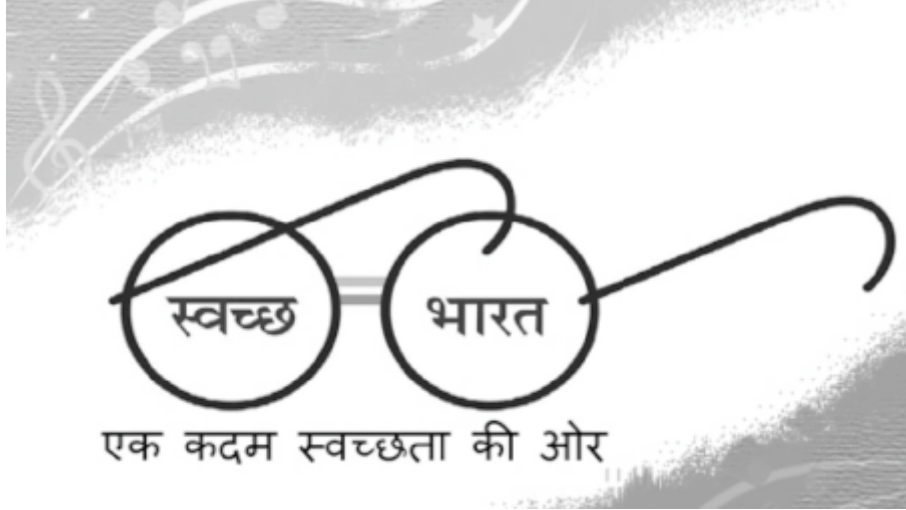

## स्वच्छ भारत अभियान आणि मी

स्वच्छ भारत अभियान किंवा स्वच्छ भारत मोहीम भारत सरकार आणि पंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदी यांच्या सर्वात महत्वाकांक्षी प्रकल्पांपैकी एक आहे. प्रधानमंत्रीनी २ ऑक्टोबर २०१४ रोजी महात्मा गांधी जयंती निमित्त स्वच्छ भारत अभियान जाहीर केले. राष्ट्रीय स्तरावर या अभियानाची दखल घेतली जात आहे.

स्वच्छ भारत अभियान या मोहिमेचे एक मुख्य ध्येय म्हणजे भारतातील सर्व गावे व शहरे हगणदारी मुक्त करणे. भारतातील रस्ते, पायाभूत सुविधांचा विकास करणे. या मोहिमेविषयी सर्वोत्तम गोष्ट म्हणजे सर्व शाळांमध्ये आणि महाविद्यालयांमध्ये स्वच्छता आणि शौचालयांची उपलब्धता यावर लक्ष केंद्रीत करणे. तसेच भारतीयांना स्वच्छतेचे महत्व आणि फायदे यांची जाणीव करून देणे.

भारत सरकारचा स्वच्छ भारत मोहीम सुरु करण्याचा हा प्रथम प्रयत्न नाही. १९९९ मध्ये भारत सरकारने “संपूर्ण स्वच्छता अभियान” सुरु केले जे नंतर पंतप्रधान मनमोहन सिंग यांनी त्याचे “निर्मल भारत अभियान” असे नामकरण केले. परंतु स्वच्छ भारत अभियानाला मोदीजींच्या नेतृत्वाखाली संजीवनी मिळाली. आपल्या शपथ विधीमध्ये शौच आणि स्वच्छता यावर बोलणारे ते जगातील पहिलेच नेते असावेत.

पंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदींनी राष्ट्रीय पातळीवर ही मोहीम राबवून नागरिकांना यात सहभागी होण्याचे आवाहन केले. त्यांनी स्वतः हाती झाडू घेतला. या सर्वांमुळे भारतीय लोकांमध्ये स्वच्छतेबद्दल जागृकता, सजगता निर्माण झाली.

कलाकार अक्षय कुमार व भूमी पेडणेकर यांच्या प्रमुख भूमिका असलेल्या एका चित्रपटाद्वारे भारतातील खुल्या शौचाच्या समस्येच्या निर्मूलनास समर्थन देण्यास सुरुवात झाली. हा चित्रपट ग्रामीण भारतातील स्त्रियांच्या समस्यांवर प्रकाश टाकतो.

त्या कोवळ्या जिवाचा काय दोष आहे ? फक्त त्या एक मुलगी म्हणून जन्माला आल्या म्हणून..... आपण मुलगी किंवा मुलगा म्हणून जन्माला यायचं हे जर गर्भातील अर्भकास समजले असते तर समाजातील स्त्रियांचे स्थान पाहून त्या मुलगी म्हणून नक्कीच जन्माला आल्या नसत्या. आपल्या समाजात मुलींकडे पाहण्याचा समाजाच्या दृष्टीकोन बदलत जाण्याऐवजी तो आधिकच गंभीर होत आहे. भारतात पुरुषसत्ताक कुटूंब पध्दती असल्यामुळे स्त्रीयांवर अनेक निर्बंध लादले जातात. माझा म्हणण्याचा अर्थ असा नाही की समाजातील सर्वच स्तरातील पुरुष हे सारखेच आहेत. असे अनेक पुरुष आहेत जे स्त्रीयांना समानतेची वागणूक देतात. त्या सर्व पुरुषांचे खरोखर मनापासून या लेखाच्या निमित्ताने आभार मानावेसे वाटतात. कारण समाजात जर मुलींना समानतेची वागणूक दिली, तर ह्या समाजाचा मुलींकडे पाहण्याचा तसेच वागण्याचा दृष्टीकोन नक्कीच बदलेल. परंतु आज पुरोगामी महाराष्ट्रात मोठ-मोठे संत क्रांतीकारक होऊन गेले, असे

अनेक समाज सेवक लाभलेल्या या महाराष्ट्रातच हे स्त्री भ्रुण हत्येसारखी अत्यंत घृणास्पद वागणूक मुलींना आजही देत आहेत.

ज्या समाजसुधारकांच्या कार्याने ही महाराष्ट्र भूमी पावन झाली त्या समाज सुधारकांच्या नावाचा उल्लेख हा केलाच पाहिजे. उदा. सावित्रीबाई फुले, महात्मा ज्योतिबा फुले, डॉ. बाबासाहेब आंबेडकर, छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराज अशा अनेक थोर व्यक्तींनी हा महाराष्ट्र अत्यंत कष्टाने उभारला आहे. परंतु काही लोक आज या थोर व्यक्तींनी दिलेले मोलाचे योगदान विसरले आहेत. म्हणून तर आज हे हात संत कार्य करण्याऐवजी महाराष्ट्राला काळीमा लावण्याजोगे काम करीत आहेत. सावित्रीबाई फुले यांनी मुलींच्या शिक्षणासाठी अत्यंत हलाखीच्या परिस्थितीमध्ये शिक्षण देण्याचे कार्य केले. मुलींसाठी सावित्रीबाई फुले यांनी शिक्षणाचा पाया रोवला. याच शिक्षणाच्या जोरावर आज मुली उत्तमरित्या कार्यरत आहेत.

परंतु खंत मात्र एका गोष्टीची वाटते मुली कितीही शिकल्या, कितीही कमावत्या झाल्या तरी त्यांना कामाच्या ठिकाणापासून ते घरापर्यंत हिनतेची वागणूक दिली जाते. आजही मुलींना चार भिंतींच्या आत कसे ठेवता येईल याचा सतत प्रयत्न केला जातो. मुलगी जर जास्त शिकलेली असेल तर मुलगा ही जास्त शिकलेला पहावा लागेल. आणि मुलगा हा जास्त शिकलेला असेल तर हुंडा जास्त दयावा लागेल. या भीतीने मुलींना शिक्षण देण्यापासून थांबवले जाते. पुरोगामी महाराष्ट्रातच मुलींची संख्या अत्यंत कमी आहे. ती म्हणजे अत्यंत शुल्लक कारणांमुळे मुलगी ही वंशाचा दिवा होऊ शकत नाही. म्हणून या कोवळ्या जिवाला हे जग पाहण्यापूर्वीच तिचा गर्भातच खून केला जातो. तिचा दोष काय आहे की, तिला थेट मृत्यू ही शिक्षा दिली जाते ? हे कळण्यापूर्वीच तिच्याच आईच्या कुशीत मनसोक्त श्वास घेत असते. तिच्यावर विश्वास ठेवून ती श्वास घेते परंतु काही वेळेस आईची इच्छा नसतानाही तिच्याच शरीरातून तिला हवाहवा असणारा भाग अलगदपणे काढला जातो. अशा वेळीही स्त्रीला काहीच बोलता येत नाही. परंतु ही परिस्थिती बदलायची असेल तर मुलींनी गप्प न बसता प्रतिकार केला पाहिजे. स्त्रीभ्रुण हत्या या विषयावर किती लिहावं आणि किती टिका करावी हे काही केल्या समजेना. या समाजातील लोकांना स्त्रीयांचे महत्व कधी समजणार हाच खरा यक्ष प्रश्न आहे.

मुली कितीही शिकल्या तरीही तिची सारी कमाई ही तिच्या सासरच्या लोकांची होते. मग तिला शिक्षण द्यायचेच कशाला ? अशा विचारांचे लोक आज समाजात वावरत आहेत. या एका कारणावरून तिचा जन्म होण्याआधीच तिची निर्घृण हत्या केली जाते. तर कधी कधी लग्नात हुंडा नाही मिळाला म्हणून तिचा मानसिक, शारीरिक छळ करून तिला आत्महत्येस प्रवृत्त केले जाते. तर कधी तिला जाळून मारले जाते. अमानुषपणे स्त्रियांचा बळी दिला जातो.

परंतु ह्या विषयांवर टिका करण्याऐवजी समाजाची मानसिक स्थिती कशी बदलेल याकडे आपण लक्ष दिले पाहिजे. याची सुरुवात ही कुटुंबातूनच झाली पाहिजे. प्रत्येक पालकांनी आपल्या मुलाला मुलींशी बोलताना, वागताना नम्रतेने, आदरतेच्या भावनेने बोलले पाहिजे. अशी जडणघडण पालकांनी मुलांना दिली पाहिजे. शेवटी मुलगा असो वा मुलगी दोघंही आईच्या उदरात ९ महिने असतात मग जन्म घेताच त्यांच्या लिंगावरूनच त्यांची जडघडण कुटुंबातूनच सुरु होते. मुला मुलींच्या कपड्यांपासून ते खेळण्यापर्यंत जडणघडण केली जाते. मग मुलांपेक्षा मुलींवर जास्त निर्बंध लादले जातात. कारण मुलगा हा वंशाचा दिवा आहे म्हणून की, मुलगी परक्याचे धन आहे तिला मात्र चार भिंतींच्या आत ठेवले जाते. कारण तिचा जन्मच रांधा वाढा उष्टी काढा. कपाळावर गोंदण जन्मापासूनच तिला कष्ट हेच आंदण म्हणून



मिळालेले असते असे संस्कार मुलींवर केले जातात.

## नोटाबंदी नंतरचे एक वर्ष

८ नोव्हेंबर २०१६ ला आपल्या देशाचे प्रंतप्रधान नरेंद्र मोदी यांनी घोषित केले की, कायदेशीर निविदा राहणार नाही त्यालाच आपण विमुद्रीकरण म्हणतो. सगळीकडेच विमुद्रीकरणाचा विषय खुप चर्चेत होता. सुरुवातीला विमुद्रीकरणामुळे लोकांना अनेक समस्यांना सामोरे जावे लागले. ५०० आणि १००० च्या नोटा बदलून घेण्यासाठी बँकांमध्ये अफाट गर्दी जमलेली असायची तसेच ATM च्या समोर सुद्धा खूप गर्दी असायची. बँकांतल्या कर्मचाऱ्यांवर तोंडावर पडेपर्यंत काम असायचे. त्यांच्या शनिवार, रविवारच्या सुट्ट्या देखील रद्द केल्या होत्या. सगळीकडे गडबडीचे वातावरण तयार झाले होते.

भ्रष्टाचार श्रीमंत लोकांमध्ये मोठ्या प्रमाणात आढळून आला. आणि त्यांनी गरीब लोकांमध्ये काही प्रमाणात पैसे वाटप केले. आणि पुन्हा काही महिन्यांनी त्यांच्याकडून तो पैसा परत घेतला. कारण एवढा सगळा पैसा ते त्याच्या खात्यात ठेवू शकत नव्हते.

विमुद्रीकरण करण्यामागचा हेतू काळा पैसा कमी करणे आणि भ्रष्टाचाराला आळा घालणे, दहशतवादी कारवाया कमी करायच्या होत्या. शस्त्रांचा व्यापार, गैरव्यवहाराने वापरला जाणारा पैसा कमी

करायचा होता. अनौपचारिक अर्थव्यवस्थेला औपचारिक अर्थव्यवस्थेत रुपांतर करायचे होते. तसेच विमुद्रीकरणामुळे आपल्याला फायदे आणि तोटे ही झालेले आहेत.

फायदे पुढीलप्रमाणे - डिजीटल व्यवहारामध्ये वाढ झाली, काश्मीर मधील ७५% दगडफेक कमी झाली, नक्षल लोकांच्या कारवाया २०% नी कमी झाल्या, प्रत्यक्ष कर संकलन वाढले, जाली नोटा कमी झाल्या, डिजीटायझेशनमुळे पारदर्शकता वाढली, ऑटोमोबाईल क्षेत्रात वाढ झाली.

तोटे पुढीलप्रमाणे - GDP कमी झाला, पैसा नसल्यामुळे लघुउद्योग बंद पडले, खासगी क्षेत्रात गुंतवणूक कमी झाली, मोठमोठ्या कंपन्यातील काही कामगारांना कामावरून काढण्यात आले. कारण मोठ्या प्रमाणात असणाऱ्या कामगारांना पगार कुठून देणार ?

बेनामी कायदा, भिम अॅप, ई गव्हर्नन्स अशी वेगवेगळी पाऊले सरकारने उचलली आहेत. सध्या विमुद्रीकरणाचे परिणाम जरी जाणवत असले तरी भविष्यात याचे फायदे नक्कीच दिसून येतील अशी आशा आहे.

अनेक मराठी चित्रपट प्रेक्षकांच्या पसंतीस उतरले. जैत रे जैत, उंबरठा, बाळा गाऊ कशी अंगाई, साधी माणसं, पिंजरा, हा खेळ सावल्यांचा असे अनेक काळजाला भिडणारे, प्रसंगी प्रेक्षकांना रडविणारे चित्रपट प्रदर्शित झाले. जयश्री गडकर, स्मिता पाटील, दादा कोंडके, निळू फुले ही नावे मराठी प्रेक्षकांच्या हृदयावर कायमची कोरली गेली.

प्रेक्षकांना खदखदून हसवणारे धुमधडाका, नवरी मिळे नवऱ्याला, गंमत जंमत, अशी ही बनवाबनवी इत्यादी चित्रपटही लोकांनी डोक्यावर घेतले. या चित्रपटांतून लक्ष्मीकांत बेर्डे, प्रिया बेर्डे, अशोक सराफ, सचिन पिळगावकर, सुप्रिया पिळगावकर, महेश कोठारे असे दिग्गज कलाकार मराठी चित्रपटाने सिनेसृष्टीला दिले.

पण नंतर काही काळाने मराठी चित्रपटसृष्टी आपल्या यशापासून दूर जाऊ लागली आणि कुठे तरी मराठी सिनेमा मागे पडू लागला. पण हे अपयश काही कायम स्वरूपी राहणारं नव्हतं. २००४ साली प्रदर्शित झालेला श्वास खूप गाजला. गोल्डन लोट्स नॅशनल अवॉर्डचा मानकरी ठरला. दादासाहेब फाळकेंच्या जीवनावर आधारित हरिश्चंद्राची फॅक्टरी, एका कलावंताच्या आयुष्यावर आधारित, नटरंग, निखळ मैत्री दर्शविणारा दुनियादारी, जातीभेद अधोरेखित करणारा फॅट्टी, झिंगाट वर थिरकवणारा पण प्रेम, जातीवाद सामाजिक भेद गडद करणारा सैराट, कुणी घर देत का घर म्हणत जुन्या पिढीची आर्त साद घालणारा नटसम्राट, संगीत जगतात मुशाफिरी करवणारा कटयार काळजात घुसली असे एकापेक्षा एक सरस, अभिमानास्पद चित्रपट प्रदर्शित झाले.

## संत कबीर

‘पोथि पढ़ि-पढ़ि जग मुआ, पंडित भया न कोय ।

ढाई अक्षर प्रेम का पढ़े सो पंडित होय ॥’

मनुष्य कई ग्रंथों - पोथियों को पढ़कर स्वयं को ज्ञानी पंडित मानने लगता है, लेकिन यदि उसमें दूसरों के प्रति प्रेम भाव नहीं तो उसका ज्ञानी होना व्यर्थ है। जिसका व्यवहार दूसरों से प्रेम से हो वही सच्चा ज्ञानी है ऐसा कहनेवाले मध्यकालीन हिंदी के प्रमुख कवि तथा निर्गुण भक्तिमार्ग के प्रवर्तक संत कबीर ने दो-दो पंक्तियों के दोहों की रचना कर मनुष्य को उपदेश करते हुए सत्य, प्रेम, अहिंसा का संदेश देते हुए भक्ति का मार्ग सबके लिए आसान कर दिया और तत्कालीन समाज में फैली अंधश्रद्धा और अज्ञान को दूर करने का प्रयास किया।



संत कबीर का जन्म उत्तर भारत के काशी इस तीर्थक्षेत्र में सन १३९८ को माना जाता है। उनकी माता विधवा ब्राह्मणी थी और उनका पालन-पोषण मुस्लिम मुलाहा जाति के दम्पति (पति-पत्नी) नीरु और निमा ने किया। अतः वे जन्म से हिंदू मुस्लिम जीवन जीनेवाले होने के बावजूद वे जाति से ऊपर उठ चुके थे। कबीर जिन सामाजिक, धार्मिक, राजनतिक परिस्थितियों में बड़े हो रहे थे उसमें उनका मन दुखी हो जाता। उनके मन में कई सवाल पैदा होते जिनके उत्तर वे अपने दोहो के माध्यम से ज्ञानी पंडितो और मुल्लाओं से पूछते पर उनका समाधान नहीं हुआ। अतः कबीर का जीवन उन प्रश्नों के उत्तरों की खोज है और जो कुछ उन्होने समझा और अपने दोहों और पदों मे बताया वह इस धरती पर जीनेवाले मनुष्य के लिए अमूल्य निधि के समान है।

कबीर के समय भारतीय समाज और धर्म का स्वरूप अंधकारमय हो गया था। भले ही भारतीय समाज को धर्म से अलग करके नहीं देखा ज्यादा सकता लेकिन कबीर के समय में सामाजिक टूटने का कारण धर्म ही था। राजनीतिक समस्या भी एक तरह से धार्मिक समस्या बन गई थी। जातिव्यवस्था प्राचीन काल से है लेकिन उसका विकृत रूप कबीर के समय में अर्थात् मध्यकाल में विकृत हो गया था। इसलिए कबीर ने धर्म के नाम पर जो जाति-पाति भेद, छुआ-छूत प्रथा, कर्मकांड, बाह्य आडंबर, प्राणी हिंसा बढ़ गई थी, उसका विरोध कर ईश्वर भक्ति के लिए सभी मार्ग खुले कर सतसंग और सदाचार को महत्वपूर्ण माना। वे कहते हैं -

“जाति-पाति पूछे नहीं कोई ।

हरी को भजै सो हरी का होई ॥”

कबीर के लिए सबसे बड़ा धर्म मानवता है और सभी पर प्रेम करना यही उसका धर्मपालन है। इसलिए कबीर ने

आधुनिक सब धर्म सम्मिलित नव समाज का स्वपन देखा। मानवता को उन्होंने हर प्रकार के बंधनोंसे मुक्त करके मानव को अखंड आनंद की प्राप्ति का मार्ग बताया। ईश्वर या खुदा का अस्तित्व सृष्टि के कण-कण में रमते हुए उन्होंने निर्गुण निराकार ईश्वर की स्थापना की। उसका स्वरूप सत्य की प्रकाशमान परम ज्योति के समान है, उसका कोई रूप-रंग नहीं हैं, वह तो केवल सकारात्मक ऊर्जा स्वरूप है जो मनुष्य को केवल आनंद ही देगी। उसे पाने के लिए व्रत, उपवास, जप-तप, पूजा-पाठ आदि बाह्य-आडंबरों की आवश्यकताही नहीं है। उनके अनुसार -

“जप नहीं तप नहीं, जो ध्यान नहीं पूजा ।  
सिव नाही, सक्ती नाही, देव नाही दूजा ॥”

ईश्वर के शिव-शक्ति ऐसे अलग-अलग रूप को वे अमान्य करते हैं। ईश्वर को सर्वव्यापी मानकर कबीर ने उसे एक ही तत्व बनाया है। उसे बाहर कहीं ढूंढने की जरूरत नहीं, वह तो सभी जीवों में प्राण के रूप में बसा है यस समझाते हुए वे कहते हैं -

“मोको कहाँ ढुँढे है बंदे  
मैं तो तेरे पास में  
ना ही मंदिर - ना मैं मसजिद  
ना काबे कैलाश में  
ना ही कौनु क्रिया - कर्म में  
ना ही योग बैराग में  
खोजी होय तो तुरते मिलिहे ।  
पलभर की तलाश में ।  
कहे कबीरा सुन भाई साधू,  
सब श्वासों के सास में ।”



समाज में धार्मिक परंपराओं के खातीर हिंदू धर्म में प्राणियों का बली देनेवाली बलीप्रथा थी वैसे मुस्लिम में भी प्राणी हत्या कर मांस भक्षण किया जाता था, यह देख वे कहते हैं -

“दिनभर रोजा रखत है रात हनत है गाय ।  
यह तो खून वह बंदगी कैसे खुशी खुदाय ॥”

मनुष्य की स्वार्थी प्रवृत्ति पर चोट करते हुए कबीर ने कहा है- “हे ईश्वर मुझे इतनाही धन देना जिसमें मैं, मेरा परिवार और मेरे दरवाजे पर आनेवाला याचक कभी भूखा न लौटे।” वे अपने ईश्वर को कभी राम कहते है कभी रहीम कभी साईं तो



कभी कुछ और लेकिन इन नामों के पीछे कोई देवी देवता नहीं वह तो नाम मात्र है। ऐसे ही वे एक दोहे में अपने ईश्वर से विनती करते हैं कि -

“साई इतना दीजिए जा में कुटुंब समाए ।

मैं भी भूखा न रहूँ, साई न भूखा जाए।”

आज तो मनुष्य धन के पीछे भाग रहा है चाहे वह साधारण व्यक्ति हो या कोई साधू लेकिन धन कमाकर रखने की ईच्छा ने मनुष्य को स्वार्थी बना दिया है। लेकिन संत कबीर ने जरूरत जितनी उतनाही मुझे दो ऐसे विनती ईश्वर से की है। यदि मनुष्य अपने दुर्गुणों को मिटा दे तो वह ईश्वरत्व को पा सकता है इसलिए कबीर ने मनुष्य के सदाचार पर अधिक बल दिया है वे कहते हैं -

“ऐसी वाणी बोलिए, मन का आपा खोय ।

औरन को सितल करे, आपही सितल होय ॥”

कबीर के अनुसार हर इंसान के बोलने में यदि मीठास हो तो सामनेवाला आपकी बातों में खो जाता है और इससे सामनेवाले का मन ही नहीं आपका मन भी शांत हो जाता है। यह सब समझने और सिखने के लिए मनुष्य जीवन में कबीर ने गुरु का महत्त्व सर्वोपरि माना है। वे कहते हैं -

“गुरु - गोबिंद दोऊ खड़े काके लागु पाय ।

बलिहारी गुरु आपने जिन गोविंद दियो बताय ॥”

कबीर के अनुसार यदि अचानक कभी मेरे सामने मेरे गुरु और ईश्वर आ जाए तो मैं सबसे पहले गुरु को नमन करूँगा क्योंकि गोविंद अर्थात ईश्वर कौन है उसे कैसे पाना है यह सब सिखानेवाले मार्गदर्शक मेरे गुरु ही है इसलिए वे ईश्वर से अधिक श्रेष्ठ है। ऐसा माननेवाले कबीर के गुरु रामानंद थे। रामानंद के सतसंग से प्रभावित कबीर ने अपने मन में उनको गुरु मान लिया पर रामानंद की भूमिका कबीर के जीवन में केवल प्रेरणा मात्र है जैसे एकलव्य ने गुरु द्रोणाचार्य को अपना गुरु माना और केवल उनसे प्रेरणा लेकर धनुर्विद्या का उच्च ज्ञान स्वयं ही प्राप्त किया वैसे ही कबीर अपनी श्रेष्ठता (प्रतिमा) के बल पर बड़े बने लेकिन उनकी विनम्रता देखिए की अपने ज्ञानवान होने का सारा श्रेय ही उन्होंने अपने गुरु रामानंद जी को दिया। कबीर जैसा शिष्य पाकर रामानंदजी धन्य हो गए।

कबीर को अपने गुरु से अक्षर ज्ञान नहीं मिला लेकिन विचार ज्ञान मिला। मध्यकाल में जीनेवाले कबीर को सामाजिक परिस्थितियों के कारण भलेही पढ़ना - लिखना संभव न हुआ हो किंतू उनका दृष्टिकोन विज्ञानवादी, समन्वयवादी है। समाज में फैले अज्ञान को मिटाने का प्रयास वे जीवनभर करते रहे। आज भी उनके दोहे हमें जीने का सही तरीका समझाते हैं। आपसी सद्भाव और प्रेम से रहने का संदेश देते हैं। इसलिए उनके विचार कालजयी हैं।

टीचर बोले, “इस सन्देश को जब पहले बोर्ड पर भी तो लिखा गया था तब तो आप सभी ने पढ़ लिया था तो अब क्यों नहीं पढ़ा जायेगा? तब एक बच्चा बोला, वह बोर्ड तो साफ था लेकिन इस बोर्ड पर बहुत सी टेडी मेडी लकीरें बनी हुई हैं। यदि इस सन्देश को इस पर लिखा गया तो यह इन लकीरों में ही मिल जायेगा। और कोई भी इसे नहीं पढ़ पाएगा। तभी टीचर मुस्कुराए और बोले, यही तो मैं आज आपको समझाने आया हूँ। सभी बच्चे एक दुसरे की तरफ देखने लगे और सोचने लगे कि इतनी छोटीसी बात हमें क्या सीखने को मिलेगा।

तभी टीचर ने बच्चों को बताया, जिस तरह टेडी मेडी लकीरो को बीच एक सुन्दर सन्देश लिखने से वह भी टेडी मेडी लकीरो जैसा हो जाता है उसी तरह यदि आपके मन में इधर उधर की फालतु की बातें होंगी अर्थात् नकारात्मक विचार होंगे तो आपके टीचर आपको कितना भी अच्छा पढ़ाए या अच्छी अच्छी बातें बताए तो वह अच्छी बातें भी आपके दुषित मन में पहुँचकर उस निगेटीव् थिंकींग जैसी ही हो जायेंगी और उन अच्छी बातों का आप पर कोई भी असर नहीं होगा।

थोड़ी देर रुकने के बाद टीचर बोले, यदि आपका मन पहले वाले बोर्ड की तरह साफ अर्थात् पॉझिटीव् थिंकींग रखता है और उसमें कोई भी नकारात्मक विचार नहीं भरी हुई है तो प्रत्येक अच्छी बात आपके मन पर इस तरह साफ साफ दिखेगी कि वही आपका चरित्र बन जाएगी और आप अपने जीवन में सफलता प्राप्त कर सकोगे। इसमें सुबह की सँन्चूरी (प्रार्थना) की भूमिका सबसे महत्वपूर्ण है इसलिए आलस न करते हुए हमें सुबह की प्रार्थना करनी चाहिए।

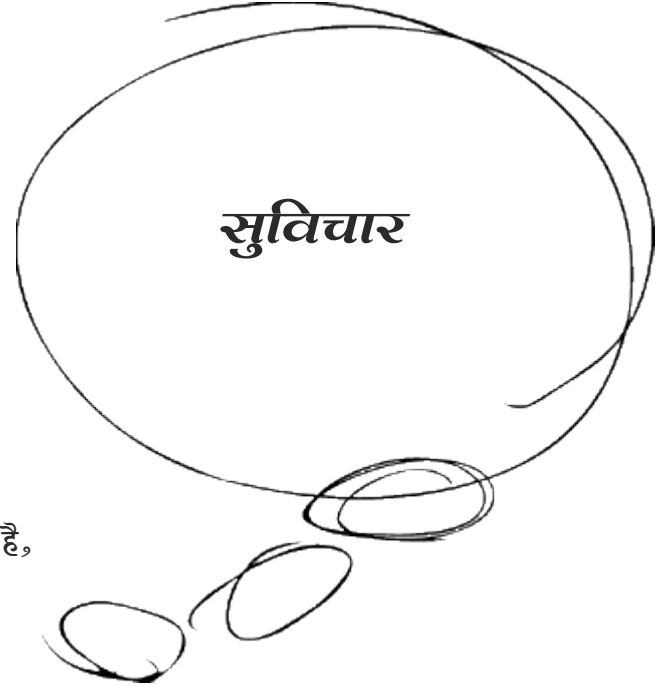
